The Tacoma-Olympia section of ASCE needs all of its members to make our section all that it can be! ### ***Committees and Section Positions***

**Government Relations Committee Chair; Approx. time commitment: 0 to 2 days per month.** The Government Relations Committee is a standing committee within the Section. The chair position is responsible for recruiting co-chair members for the committee and contributing to committee initiatives and activities. The committee may write articles for our newsletter, mobilize members to action for important legislative events or bills, and coordinate with our state lobbyist.
