## **"CREATION CARE" SUNDAY, REV. PHIL AMERSON PREACHING**

In 2017, Earth Day falls in the week following Easter. Might this be an instructive time to instill an urgency to engage in acts of environmental holiness? We pray together for God's kingdom to come "on earth as it is in heaven." What might this mean in the face of the environmental decay and the threats of climate change? What will this mean if we are to live as Easter People? What if it means moving beyond well intentioned programs of sustainability and stewardship, and pausing to better hear the cry of the earth and the cry of the poor?

*The Social Principles of the United Methodist Church begins the section on "The Natural World" with this sentence: All creation is the Lord's, and we are responsible for the ways in which we use and abuse it.* On April 23, St. Mark's will reflect on this vital aspect of Christian faith.

Rev. Phil Amerson will preach that day, and his sermon is titled "With Apologies to Easter: Lament for Our Common Home.", and his texts will be Psalm 16, John 20: 26-31 and Acts 2:32. There will be a lunch following the service, and a time for conversation.

Phil is President Emeritus of Garrett-Evangelical Theological Seminary. Phil and, his wife, Elaine lived in Bloomington from 1992 to 2000 when he served as pastor of First United Methodist Church. Recently they returned to Bloomington after living on a small farm near LaPorte, Indiana where he kept bees and enjoyed gardening. They also love city living and now reside in "downtown" Bloomington, and connect with the St. Mark's community of faith. Their years of ministry in Indiana included the founding of Patchwork Ministries in Evansville and serving as pastor of three United Methodist congregations (St. Johns: Evansville; Broadway: Indianapolis and First UMC: Bloomington).

Currently Phil consults with the *Wellbeing at Work: Flourishing in Ministry* research at the University of Notre Dame and is interim director of the *Course of Study School* for United Methodist local pastors in Indiana. He writes an occasional blog at [philiipamerson.com](http://philiipamerson.com) and speaks frequently on issues of faith and justice including a focus on creation care. The Amersons have two children: daughter, Lydia Murray, in Chicago and son, Andrew, in San Francisco and four grandchildren (Gus and Eleanor in San Francisco and Colin and Zack in Chicago).

## APRIL CLASSES:

*(Please note that Adult Sunday School Classes will not meet on Easter Sunday).*

### BIBLE BANTER

The Bible Banter class uses the Scripture text for the morning's sermon as a discussion-starter. Looking at the passage in its larger context, and sometimes exploring a bit of Bible-writing history, we offer thoughts on what the morning's sermon might look like, based on the Scripture the pastor has selected. We leave time to discuss implications of the Scripture on our own lives, and often find ourselves delving into topics that wind up far afield from the morning's original topic. You are invited to bring some coffee/breakfast from Garton Hall into Room 11 and join the conversation.

### NOMADS

During April the Nomads will be discussing chapters from the center section of *Amazing Grace* in which the author, Kathleen Norris, reflects on dozens of religious terms, such as "Grace & Apostasy," that reflect on part of the labyrinth she moved through as she returned to the Christian faith after many years. The class meets every Sunday at 9:15am in Room 10 and all are welcome, with no preparation required.

### PILGRIMS

The Pilgrims Class studies the Holy Land using video lectures, [The Holy Land Revealed](#), by Dr. Jodi Magness, University of North Carolina at Chapel Hill. Each week, a discussion follows the video. All are welcome to join Pilgrims at 9:15am each Sunday in Room 13. The lecture series covers the ancient history of the Holy Land from 906 BC through 70 AD. Historical sources, such as the Hebrew Bible, the Dead Sea Scrolls, the writings of Josephus and Philo, the New Testament and the Mishnah and Talmud, along with the archaeology of the ancient Near East provide a more complete picture of ancient societies.

April 2: Lecture #13– "Pharisees and Sadducees"

Some of the Jewish groups that emerged in opposition to the Hasmoneans, specifically the Sadducees and the Pharisees

April 9th, 16th, 23rd and 30th

A discussion of another sect that emerged during the Late Second Temple Period, the Essenes, and the scrolls left behind by their community at Qumran which was established during the Hasmonean period and was occupied through the period of the Roman takeover and the reign of Herod the Great.
