We are pleased to share that the Pastor-Staff-Parish Committee has approved the hiring of Mr. Rodney Long as St. Mark's new part-time "Director of Youth Ministries." Rodney brings great gifts and experience to this role. Originally from Georgia, he is a graduate of Columbus State University, where he double majored in Music Education and Voice Performance. Rodney was a high school music teacher in Maryland for five years before moving to Bloomington this past fall to pursue a Masters of Music degree in voice performance at IU.

Rodney has a warm personality, encouraging spirit, welcoming energy, and a passion for working with youth and families. He is especially strong in engaging youth, creating positive relationships, and fostering healthy community. His vision is to connect with families & to create opportunities for youth to engage in all areas of Christian education, service, and worship, while building a strong youth presence in the church. A gifted and talented musician, Rodney landed his first official job in ministry playing piano for a Baptist Church when he was 14 years old.

We are very grateful to the Search Committee for their dedication, thoughtfulness and wisdom throughout this process. There are also a few projects specific to St. Mark's:


- Help with Nursery School & Kindergarten room projects.

“WHERE THE HEART IS” AN UPDATE & THANK YOU FROM THE STEWARDSHIP TEAM

As of January 2, 119 pledge cards had been returned for the **2018 Stewardship Campaign: Where the Heart Is**, totaling \$452,220. Also, 101 new and additional pledge cards had been returned for the capital campaign **Project St. Mark's: The Sequel** (which includes the recent repaving of the parking lot). This total is now \$206,220.

It is called the Cultural Foundations of Peace Series, and seeks to demonstrate how different elements of culture – sports, music, film itself, religion, law, business, gender – provide avenues into peacebuilding apart from governmental negotiation of peace processes. SUNDAY, JANUARY 28TH, 5:30PM "GANDHI." The iconic 1982 story of the life and work of Gandhi in his efforts to promote rights in South Africa, independence for India, and peace between Muslims and Hindus.

SUNDAY, FEBRUARY 4TH, 2:00PM "AS ONE." Early 1990's story of South and North Korea coming together to form a joint table tennis team to compete in an Asian championship.

SUNDAY, FEBRUARY 18TH, 2:00PM "SWEET DREAMS." In post-genocide Rwanda, a group of women drawn from both Hutus and Tutsi groups form a drumming group, becoming the first women to publicly drum in the country.

SUNDAY, MARCH 4TH, 5:30PM "JOYEUX NOEL." This film portrays the famous "Christmas Truce" of World War I, where armies of Germany, France and Scotland spontaneously came together with song, sports, trade, and religion to rise up from their trenches and celebrate Christmas together. Screening takes place in the IU Moving Image Archive Screening Room in the Herman B Wells Library.

NOMADS SUNDAY SCHOOL CLASS RAISING FUNDS TO AID BROADWAY UMC, INDIANAPOLIS

As was announced in worship last month, there was a fire on December 20th in the fellowship hall of Broadway United Methodist Church, Indianapolis. Although it could have been much worse, the sanctuary was filled with soot and now the pews must be removed for individual cleaning; the organ must be dismantled and cleaned at considerable expense; ceiling tiles must be replaced, and much more.

The Nomads Sunday School Class has been raising money to assist Broadway. They invited the entire church community to join the effort on January 7th by contributing donations for breakfast, which would all go to Broadway UMC. A donor agreed to match all the breakfast financial donations up to \$200.00.

Broadway was one of the first Reconciling Ministries churches in our state and took a leadership role in interpreting the UMC Open Door policy to mean that "All Means All!" And the St. Mark's community has several personal connections to Broadway, including Phil Amerson and Mary Ann Moman, who served as pastors there.

adult sunday school: january classes

BIBLE BANTER

The Bible Banter class uses the Scripture text for the morning's sermon as a discussion-starter. Looking at the passage in its larger context, and sometimes exploring a bit of Bible-writing history, we offer thoughts on what the morning's sermon might look like, based on the Scripture the pastor has selected. We leave time to discuss implications of the Scripture on our own lives, and often find ourselves delving into topics that wind up far afield from the morning's original topic. You are invited to bring some coffee/breakfast from Garton Hall into Room 11 and join the conversation.

NOMADS

Nomads class will read & discuss The Gift of Years: Growing Older Gracefully by Joan Chittister. This book consists of a series of very short essays on many different aspects of life that might change as we approach older age. All are welcome to join Nomads in Room 10 (even without reading the book!).

PILGRIMS

Pilgrims Sunday Morning Class is studying how the five major religions – Judaism, Christianity, Islam, Buddhism and Hinduism – address the same core issues. We are embarking on this effort using a video lecture series titled **Comparative Religion** by Professor Charles Kimball, Professor and Director of the Religious Studies Program at the University of Oklahoma.

As we explore the nature of faith, the lecture series provides an in-depth look at how the five great faiths address the issues of creation stories, concepts of the divine and ultimate goals.

The January lectures include:

JAN 7TH - LECTURE # 13 – “FROM BIRTH TO DEATH – RELIGIOUS RITUALS”

In this lecture, Prof. Kimball explores the common features of religious rituals that mark key stages in the lifecycle: birth, childhood, coming-of-age, marriage and death.

JAN 14TH - LECTURE # 14 – “DAILY, WEEKLY, ANNUAL RELIGIOUS RITUALS”

Most religions incorporate rituals that recount and reenact their sacred stories on an annual basis. These dramatic reenactments of key events in the religion serve important pedagogical, sociological and psychological function for participants.

JAN 21ST – LECTURE # 15 – “RITUAL SACRIFICE IN THE WORLD’S RELIGIONS”

Prof. Kimball provides illustrations from different religions clarifying the ways religious people sacrifice time, money, and physical pleasures to achieve desired goals.

JAN 28TH – LECTURE # 16 – “THE HUMAN PREDICAMENT – HOW TO OVERCOME IT”

The world as we experience it is not ideal. Religions are united in presenting worldviews that explain the nature and purpose of existence.

All are welcome at any point in the lecture series. Come join us for the presentation and the resulting discussion at 9:15am in Room 13.
