- As Interim Dean: Opened the Memory Assessment and Research Center for Alzheimer's patients, organized research meetings, emphasized grant submission through a summer stipend program, set meetings with local superintendents for college initiatives, obtained laboratory space for the department of psychology and counseling, and met with business leaders to determine interests in externally funded projects.
- Provide principal training for administrators in the Toledo district of Belize from 2008 to present as a part of an ongoing school development/research project. This training is a collaborative effort between the humanitarian group *Teachers for a Better Belize* and the Toledo Ministry of Education. I am

currently the chairperson of the *Teachers for a Better Belize* board. Hosted 7 Belize principals in Texas – 2015, and hosted 5 Belize Teachers – 2016.

- Organized and led international education trips for UT Tyler students in which they experienced the culture, geography, and schools of southern Belize in 2011, 2014, 2015, 2016, and 2017.
- Co-founded the UT Tyler Innovation Academy charter school that provides a model that uses technology for knowledge-based learning and project-based activities for higher level learning while focusing on a STEM (science, technology, engineering, and math) framework. I was the founding superintendent and continue to serve as the faculty advisor.
- Co-editor of the Texas Council of Professors of Educational Administration book *Texas Public School Organization and Administration* (13th, 14th, and 15th eds.).
- Provided teacher workshops on writing and science in Pohnpei, Micronesia in assistance of a Gear-Up grant.
- Organized an international education trips for UT Tyler students in which they experienced the culture, geography, and schools of southern Belize in 2011, 2014, 2015, 2016, and 2017.
- Developed hybrid format superintendent courses (60% of courses online; 40% face-to-face on Saturdays) that increased enrollment by 200%. This led to 100% online courses in 2008 that further increased enrollments. Assisted in the development of the online principal program, which had enrollment increases of over 250% without adding faculty. I was awarded the Outstanding Distance Learning Faculty by the Northeast Texas Consortium of Colleges and Universities in 2014.
- Organized marketing strategies for The University of Texas at Tyler's K-12 programs, including online advertisements, email marketing, and booth purchases at conferences. Initiated a marketing campaign that sent weekly videos to schools on educational issues. There were over 65,000 views in the first year.
- Provided opportunities for students to present and publish manuscripts, either with or without faculty assistance, in the superintendent program. This has resulted in 8 student presentations and over 35 student publications.
- Published 46 articles in a variety of journals and books, with 35 being refereed. Major topics include bond elections, church/state issues, and Belize studies. In addition, over 30 papers have been presented at conferences.
- Co-edited the national journal *School Leadership Review* from 2008-2011. This journal was several issues behind when it was transferred. The journal was brought up to date and listed in Cabell's before being transferred to another editor.
- Awarded the first J. Burns Brown Fellowship for promising young faculty from 2008-2009. This fellowship included a monetary award that was used for travel to continue Belize training/research. Awarded the Outstanding Distance Learning Faculty by the Northeast Texas Consortium of Colleges and Universities in 2014. Awarded the UT Tyler Impact Award for making a positive sustainable change in addressing and bringing awareness to social issues in 2014.
