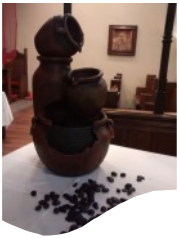


# LENT THROUGH EASTER

## AND HOW ARE WE TO PRAY . . .

When Jesus's disciples asked him how to pray, he taught them the words that we now call the Lord's Prayer. This is the first prayer many of us learn and, for Protestants, it is one of the few prayers that we memorize and recite regularly in worship. What does this prayer teach us about our relationship with God and our relationships with others? How can it help us better understand the purpose of prayer and maintain the discipline of prayer to which we are called? In worship and in adult forums, we will hear and discuss scriptures about prayer as well as try out new prayer practices that involve more than words. Join us as we seek to learn from Jesus how to pray.



Lenten Prayer Stations - Using a variety of physical objects, including stones, ribbons, and paper, we will offer prayers for wisdom, reconciliation, mercy, and justice throughout the season of Lent. Prayer stations and instructions are located in the sanctuary.
