What is Project IHSIP?

- A collaborative project involving MEMSPA, MDHHS, MDE and MISHCA
- Focuses on improving student health and academic achievement
- Anticipated funding through a state-wide grant*

BENEFITS:

- ◆ Opportunity to participate in a state-wide pilot project that aims to improve student health and academic achievement
- ◆ Receive intensive technical assistance from collaborative partners to support implementation
- ◆ Free training and health education curriculum instructional materials for teachers*
- ◆ Onsite training in ASCD's Whole Child Approach model (WSCC)
- ◆ Funding to cover stipends, substitutes, food and refreshments for training and school improvement planning activities*
- ◆ Registration, lodging and travel costs covered for School Health conference at Boyne Mountain for two people to attend June 2017*
- ◆ Consultation on culture/climate school improvement goal and plan
- ◆ Opportunity to showcase your project at 2018 MEMSPA Annual Conference or Leadership Academy

COMMITMENTS:

- ◆ Incorporate a health related goal into your School Improvement plan for 2017-18
- ◆ Conduct the Healthy School Action Tool (HSAT) to assess school health environment needs
- ◆ Implement the Michigan Model for Health™ curriculum building wide and conduct pre and post testing (if staff is not trained, free training and curriculum materials provided)
- ◆ Hold a two hour staff training on ASCD's Whole Child Approach (Presenter provided)
- ◆ Be willing to present your implementation success at the MEMSPA Annual Conference or Leadership Academy
- ◆ Superintendent's support of your school's participation including signature on Memorandum of Understanding

*MEMSPA, in collaboration with MDHHS has applied for a grant to support these activities. We expect notification by March 2017. Grant activities will depend upon being awarded the grant and the level of funding awarded.
