#### **DESCRIPTION OF ACTIVITIES**

### Golf Tournament: Reems Creek - May 21, Noon - 5 p.m.



Nestled in the foothills of the Blue Ridge Mountains, Reems Creek Golf Club offers a relaxing and picturesque setting for a day on the links. The golf course was constructed by Hawtree & Sons, a British firm that sculpted a layout reminiscent of the look and feel of the Scottish Highlands. Located in Weaverville, North Carolina, Reems Creek is only a short drive from Asheville and many other neighboring communities. A day at Reems Creek is a perfect chance to take a local golfing getaway. This event includes lunch.

### Tour: Asheville Art Safari – May 21, 11 a.m. – 3 p.m.

Tour will depart from the Renaissance and begin at the Folk Art Center, owned and operated by the Southern Highland Handicraft Guild, the center houses revolving exhibits and demonstrations showcasing the finest crafters in the Blue Ridge region. Next is lunch at one of Asheville's finer cafés, followed by a trip to Asheville's River Arts District, the hip and upcoming warehouse-turned-art-district along the French Broad River with over 100 artists in the district representing almost every possible artistic medium. Popular artists include glass blowers, potters, metal workers and textile artists, but our guide will make appointments with at least three prominent artists who are more willing to demonstrate their craft and are open to communicate about their techniques and works to our group. This event includes lunch.

### **Tour: LaZoom Asheville Tour** – May 21, 2 – 3:30 p.m. OR May 22, 2 – 3:30 p.m.

LaZoom's citywide tours are the best possible introduction to Asheville—even if you've lived here for years! Historical and hysterical, tours feature outrageously entertaining tour guides, outlandish comedy skits complete with special appearances, loads of Asheville information, and incredible views of downtown Asheville and the rarely seen but stunningly beautiful Montford neighborhood, not to mention the burgeoning River Arts District! It's like a vaudeville show on wheels! Includes a 10-minute break at The Thirsty Monk. Beer and wine are welcome onboard, but absolutely no liquor, please! All beer and wine must be opened and consumed on the bus. (Passengers must be at least 21 years old to drink on the bus, and must have valid ID.) Must be 13 or older.

# Tour: Asheville Microbrewery Tour – May 22, Noon - 4 p.m.

Tour will depart from the Renaissance and begin with an all-inclusive beer tasting lunch, then behind-the-scenes access tour through several Downtown Asheville microbreweries, where you will be provided with brew-master access, insight into the beer brewing process, tastings of many local craft brews and seasonal varieties on tap, and an educated introduction to the diverse brewing scene of Asheville and its history. Your guide is a friendly beer connoisseur and brewing enthusiast who is interested in expanding your taste and palette of unique ale. Breweries are chosen based on availability of venues such as the Bhramari Brewhouse, Asheville Brewing Company, the Lexington Avenue Brewery, Green Man, Hi-Wire Brewing, Catawba Brewing Company, Wedge Brewing Company, Wicked Weed's Funkatorium and the Twin Leaf Brewery. This event includes lunch.

#### Tour: Biltmore House, Gardens & Winery Tour – May 22, Noon - 4 p.m.

Tour will depart from the Renaissance and begin with lunch at Biltmore followed by tours of the Biltmore House, Estate Gardens and Winery. Famous for its wealth, guests marvel at the magnificent residence containing 34 bedrooms, 43 bathrooms, and 65 fireplaces covering four acres of floor space, all carefully preserved, appearing as they did a century ago. After exiting the Biltmore House, you can choose between walking through the Biltmore Estate Gardens or shop in the Stable Arcade adjacent to the Biltmore House. A new development on Biltmore Estate is an exhibition space, village green with live entertainment, dining, shopping, and a new outdoor adventure center. The pedestrian-friendly village encompasses the Winery, Historic Barn and interpretive Farm Area, as well as Biltmore's Kitchen Garden. The Winery offers glimpses into the winemaking process and complimentary wine tastings, all included in your estate admission. The Wine Shop contains a wide selection of gourmet foods, coffees, and giftware in addition to Biltmore Wines. This event includes lunch.
