Danielle Ramo, PhD, Assistant Professor in the UCSF Department of Psychiatry and clinical psychologist, has served on the Scientific Advisory Board of Being Adept since 2010. She has used her expertise in teen substance use and abuse to help shape the Being Adept curriculum. We are thrilled to have her with us to discuss the complicated landscape of teen marijuana use in the current social and political climate. She will review the current trends in marijuana use and how recent policies (e.g., legalization) may effect teen use. She will also share evidence on the effect of marijuana use on the teen brain and behavior, and discuss the differences between teen and adult use. Finally, Dr. Ramo will put forth some realistic and innovative strategies for dealing with teen marijuana use in an era in which adult use is increasingly normal.
