But I'll admit, even after preaching sermons urging us to not let anything steal these gifts and singing songs of

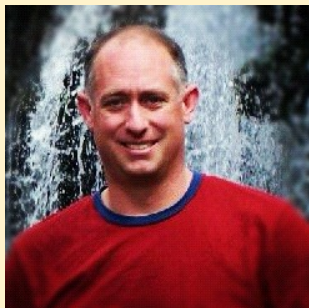
these great gifts, I have found myself wondering how do I really claim them for my life: How do I really claim God's gift of peace? How do I really hold onto hope? How do I have live
