I am looking forward to working with all of you during the upcoming Program Year, getting to know you and hearing about how each Department promotes the Program and inspires volunteers to become involved. This year's theme **Hands that Serve, Hearts That Care** is the very lifeblood of the Hospital Program. AWARD #1: Most outstanding innovative method of serving hospitalized Veterans

- **Citation** to every to every Auxiliary that demonstrates an innovative method to serve hospitalized Veterans. Citations will be mailed directly to the participating Auxiliaries from National Headquarters.
- **Citation and \$25** to one Auxiliary in each of the four (4) Conferences with the most outstanding innovative method of serving hospitalized veterans. Winners will be announced and awards presented at the 2023 National Convention in Phoenix, Arizona.

Auxiliaries are to send this completed form to their Department Hospital Chairman by March 31, 2023.

Recruiting and training volunteers is crucial to the success of the Hospital Program, so I am hoping to see great strides in that area. Keep in mind that an individual or group does not have to be associated with the VFW Auxiliary to volunteer (although they must be willing to adhere to Auxiliary protocol). Sadly, COVID-19 is still with us, so it is imperative to coordinate with the facility before planning any functions, whether it is a VA Hospital, nursing home, community hospital, clinic or skilled care center, etc. If you need ideas for activities or recognizing volunteer efforts, please take a moment to check out the Hospital Resources that will be available in the weeks following National Convention by logging into your MALTA profile. There are awards for members, nonmembers, and outstanding volunteers, and it is up to our Hospital Chairmen to identify and reward deserving individuals or groups.
