FROM THE RECTOR

We are now at that point in our lives where we no longer feel the need nor the responsibility of having to entertain our adult children. Thank God there are no more of those dreadful trips to *Alvin's Island* to buy tacky souvenirs we will throw away before going back home. Stop and listen for the small quiet voice of God speaking to your heart. Spend sabbath time laughing with dear friends. Take long walks and short naps. Try cooking at least one new recipe. Read a book from beginning to end. Finally, if you are really up to the challenge; get off of Facebook and disconnect from all WIFI for a couple of days. Do not respond to any emails and while you are at it try turning off your cell phone for one entire day.

The world will continue to function without you using social media, the internet, and so called modern technology. You never know what might come into your life when you make room for it. I made the room in my life during my sabbatical and I found All Saints' Church. Thanks be to God!

At the January Annual Meeting you were alerted that the Church would be operating with a \$43,000 budget deficit in 2017.



A Budget Deficit means we plan to spend more money this year than we take in.




