


Forgot Password?

Step 1: Click the **Forgot Password** button underneath the login button.





Step 2: Enter your email address in the **Email** field and click the **Continue** button.



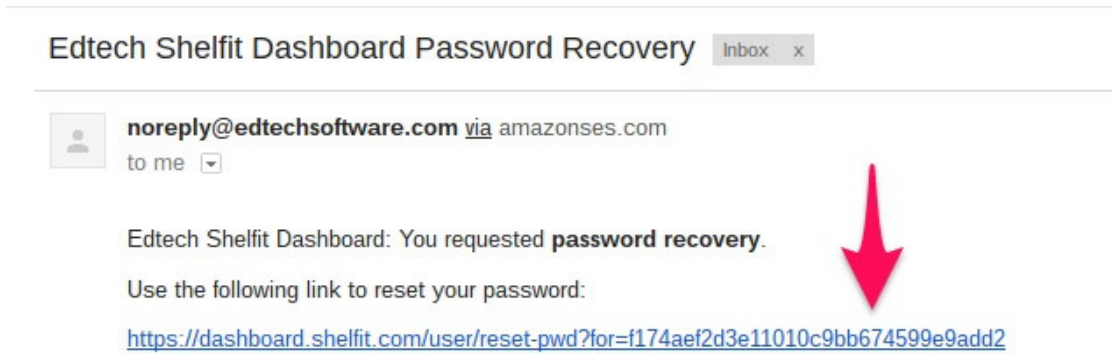


