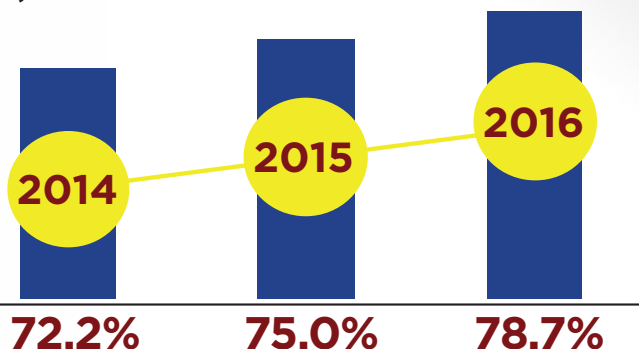




GRADUATION RATES 2015-2016
