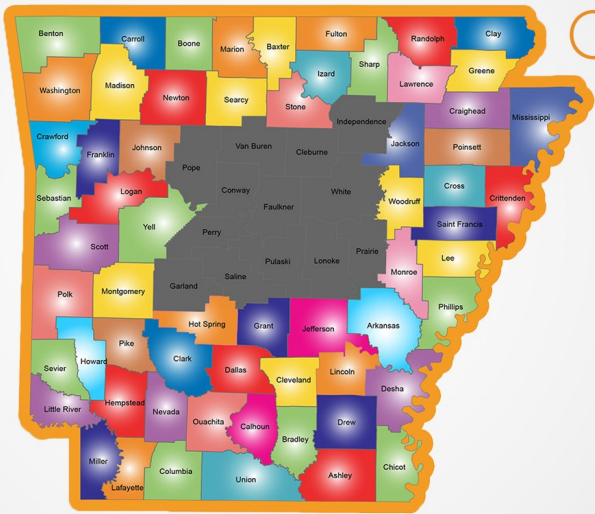

By the time you read this Proclaim will be history. And we're believing it will be good history.

One more word about **Sunday night at the Farmer's Market:** Elizabeth Standage, Danny, Brent, and Bill, came up with the idea, and it was a great one. Bob and Mary Goodman, Chip Blocker, and the rest of their team of volunteers cooked burgers and dogs to feed around 600 people or more—including some of the homeless who hang around that area. Heather Murphy made sure the bouncy houses got down there and set up for kids. Danny and his volunteers tended to the details. Stephen got the sound equipment there. Debbie McCollum and R. L. Smith helped with the baptisms. Just a lot of people made it happen. My thanks to each one of you.

And by the way, thank you for the surprise birthday celebration after Monday's service. Thank you for all the kind expressions and cards. A person only turns 60 once. I'm grateful I could turn 60 with you.

This Sunday morning we continue our series, **When God Crosses His Heart.** This week we are considering God's promise to hold us in His hand from which nothing can snatch us out: eternal security. We will do this with a celebration of **baptism and the Lord's Supper.** Let's be in our place to worship God on Sunday. See you then.

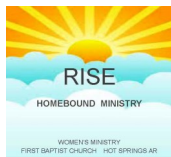
First Baptist Quilters
