

Creating Your Own Path: Successful Transitions For Persons With Autism

This one-day conference will be held on Thursday, September 6, 2018, from 8:00 a.m. to 4:00 p.m. at Broadmoor Baptist Church in Madison, Mississippi. The importance of transitions for those with autism cannot be stressed enough and doesn't happen overnight. The objective of this conference is to provide parents, advocates, professionals, and people with autism the opportunity to learn about resources and evidence-based best practices regarding planning and executing successful transitions, no matter the age.

Keynote: Megan Stevenson, M.A., will deliver the keynote address for the conference this year. Megan serves as director of the Erskine Green Training Institute in Muncie, Indiana. The Institute provides postsecondary vocational training to prepare individuals with disabilities for employment in the hospitality, food service and healthcare support industries. Megan holds a Bachelor of Arts degree in Applied Behavior Analysis from Ball State University.

Who should attend: Anyone who works with, designs, provides supports to, or is a person with autism, such as: teachers, para-professionals, school administrators, advocates, parents, support coordinators, nursing home administrators, and social workers.
