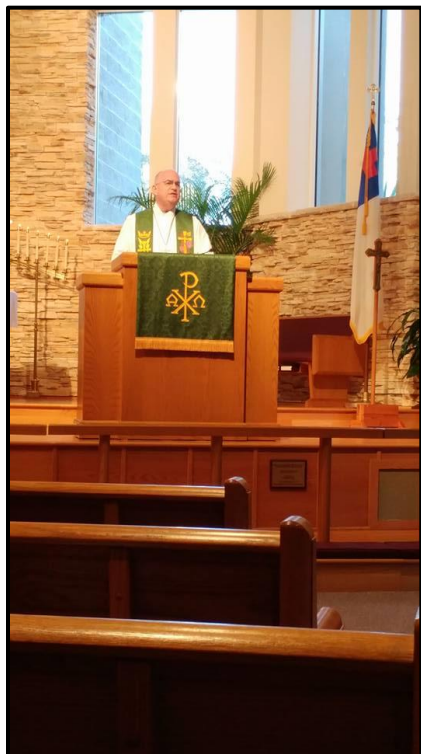

### ***Still in the States and Still Sharing***

When we left Ghana in October of last year, we had a return flight booked for December 16. We were looking forward to being with our congregation in Tamale for the Christmas holidays. We had make-up training scheduled for mid-January and a meeting with our regional pastor contacts for late January. We thought we had it all figured out. We thought we had things well in-hand. But that is the problem, we thought we had it all planned out. It was God, rather, who had it all within His almighty hand.

There is a famous line that comes from an inciteful passage from Thomas à Kempis' monumental work, "The Imitation of Christ." He writes: *"For the resolutions of the just depend rather on the grace of God than on their own wisdom; and in Him they always put their trust, whatever they take in hand. **For man proposes, but God disposes**; neither is the way of man in his own hands."*

God's ways may not be the same as our timing, but it is the best timing. God's ways may not be the same as our plan, but it is the best plan. And so, here in late January, we are still here due to Dale's health issues. But there is good news! We believe we finally have the right diagnosis: tropical sprue, a highly treatable illness that can be cured.

For those of you with celiac sprue, there is no relationship! They aren't sure what causes tropical sprue, and they can only diagnose it from looking at what your body is missing, vitamins D and B as well as folic acid. So, Dale is undergoing a lot of vitamin replacement, and we are looking for a good antibiotic that won't react badly with his system. We ask for your prayers both for his healing as well as for the doctors that they would have wisdom and skill for dealing with this. We will be seeing a specialist, a doctor who has some experience with African tropical diseases, on February 9<sup>th</sup>. Ask our gracious Father in heaven to bless that meeting.

While we are here, we have tried to be good stewards of our time. We visited Beautiful Savior Lutheran Church, Sarasota, FL, on January 15, a congregation with whom we have had no prior contact. It was a warm and welcoming visit, filled with lots of thanks for our service as well as questions about the nature of our work – both as a congregational pastor and as a theological educator in the northeast of Ghana. And we thank God that they collected a door offering to give financial support to the work over there.

We are now praying that we soon will be back in our adopted home city of Tamale, northern Ghana. We hear from them fairly often. They too are praying for Dale's health and for our safe return. And we pray for them. There is so much to do there! There are people who do not know God's love in Christ, and we want to show it to them as we live with them and tell it to them in the words of Scripture itself.

So, wherever God has you at the moment, rejoice, for *"the resolutions of the just depend rather on the grace of God than on their own wisdom."* May God keep us all in His gracious hand and may Christ be seen and heard from us all. Amen.
