Interesting Facts About Mexican Independence Day

+ Father Miquel Hidalgo was the leader in the Mexican war. He was also a priest.

+ During the celebration people also decorate their house. You can see the decorative products in the colors of red, green, and white.

+ El Grito de Dolores was celebrated on the 15th of September.

+ 'Viva Mexico!' is the common phrase that Mexicans use to express their love of the country.

+ The way people celebrate the Mexican Independence Day is similar to the way in which Americans celebrate the Fourth of July.

+ The event is celebrated throughout the country with family parties, food and parades.

On the 15th of September we said our goodbyes to missionary Tyler McMiller who is now serving the Lord in the Dominican Republic. His departure fills us with sadness. We are very thankful for the great ministry that he carried out during the time that he served in Mexico. At the same time we pray that God blesses abundantly his new missionary assignment.

One of the important goals that we have in Mexico is that of training national pastors. Another goal before us is that of training national deaconesses. To this end we have a training course scheduled for the first week of October. The deaconess candidates will study the epistles of St. Paul. We look forward to this conference that will increase their theological understanding as well as provide the opportunity for fellowship. We thank the members of the church, 'Todos los Santos', in Guadalajara, for their willingness to host this conference.

In Mexico City we have the headquarters for our 'Christ for All the Nations' office. (The Spanish equivalent: Cristo Para Todas las Naciones.) This program provides vital outreach in the local schools and throughout the metropolitan area. This outreach organization receives its support from Lutheran Hour Ministries. We give thanks for our Mexican nationals who staff this office and do the outreach.

In addition to his pastoral duties at San Pedro, Dan is teaching a study of the Gospel of St. John and another course on liturgy. Some of our deaconess candidates and pastoral candidates are involved in these classes.

Mexican Independence Day, commemorates 16 September 1810, when a parish priest named Miguel Hidalgo rang the church bells in the town of Delores and called his parishioners to fight for independence. Today, the date is marked by parades, fairs, dancing, and fireworks.
