The Christmas break went by quickly, and we were soon submerged in all of the frantic preparations and business involved with running a new school (can you imagine?!). Four pre-seminary students began their work in January, studying English at the British Council, and Scripture with Pastor Devanesan and me. I am glad to report that things are going well so far, although last week became very difficult, after several students caught a fever, and one was admitted to hospital for several days. Thankfully he has recovered, and teaching continues. It is a joy to see this new community functioning more or less according to plan! Next week I will teach an intensive course on the Gospel of Matthew, which usually takes up all of the time and energy a week can provide. All of the students are very happy to have their new library in place, and glad that we can have lectures in our own renovated space, free from mosquitoes.

What Next for a Seminary?

Now that the pre-seminary school is open, the challenge will be to keep it open, and continue to admit new students and prepare them for seminary. The problem is that we are already at maximum capacity, with no additional housing. At this time, the best option seems to be to expand the seminary in Colombo, instead of developing a separate campus. We will have to purchase some land adjacent to the current property, then build new housing (especially for married students), offices, and a sanctuary.
