Introduction

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Grant Cycle Announcement

Kaiser Permanente is pleased to announce the 2017 Community Benefit Grants Program for the Napa Solano Area, which includes the Vacaville and Vallejo Medical Centers.

The Napa Solano Area grantmaking program supports local non-profit, public health, and human service organizations that improve the health of under-served communities in the Solano County communities of Benicia, Dixon, Fairfield, Rio Vista, Suisun City, Vacaville, and Vallejo, and the Napa County communities of American Canyon, Calistoga, Napa, Oakville, Rutherford, St. Helena, and Yountville.

Health Funding Priorities

Every three years the Napa Solano Area conducts an extensive community health needs assessment to identify the health and social needs of our local communities. Our funding priorities for 2017 – 2019 were selected based on the data and community input we received.

Napa Solano Area health funding priorities and strategies are outlined below. These strategies represent the types of projects that will be considered for grant funding. Programs that do not specifically address the health funding priorities and strategies cannot be considered for funding.

Healthy Eating Active Living

Grant range for all strategies: \$20,000 - \$50,000

Grant range for all strategies: \$20,000 - \$40,000

Grant range for first strategy: Up to \$20,000

Grant range for second strategy: Up to \$50,000

Kaiser Permanente will not consider funding requests from the following types of organizations or for the following activities/purposes: religious purposes; partisan political, fraternal, athletic, international or social organizations; endowments; memorials; individuals; field trips; or tours.
