Saturday August 27 –Let's Talk Again. A Forum led by representatives from the Baytown Police and members of the community will be in the Tejas Room of the Baytown Community Center from 9am to 1pm .

In response to recent events involving controversial shootings by police and the shooting of Dallas officers, the Baytown Police Department, area churches and the J.D. Walker Advisory Committee are hosting a community forum titled "Let's Talk Again.

"The event will allow citizens to speak to the police about their concerns involving community/police relationship and to offer suggestions on how that relationship can improve," said Luzette Watkins, a Baytown police spokeswoman. Watkins said the event will include a panel of police officers with a combined experience of 40 years.

Baytown Police Chief Keith Dougherty said this event is a response to a community outcry to learn more about the police and proper responses. "It will educate and answer questions," Dougherty said. "We stay involved year round, but this is an opportunity to be involved with some groups that we normally do not involve ourselves with on a regular basis."
