1 The New Hampshire Office of Legislative Budget Assistant is looking for feedback on the NH Department of Environmental Services' (NHDES) Wetland Bureau permitting processes.

To gather this feedback, the office created a survey geared towards stakeholders familiar with Wetlands Bureau operations. Responses will be used to inform audit work and evaluate the performance of the Wetlands Bureau.
