

More than 1,200 years ago, a group of Caddo Indians known as the Hasinai built a village 26 miles west of present-day Nacogdoches, the current location of the Caddo Mounds State Historic Site. The site was the southwestern-most ceremonial center for the great Mound Builder culture. Today, three earthen mounds still rise from the lush Pineywoods landscape, where visitors discover the everyday life and the history of this ancient civilization. As part of the TAEE fieldtrip, you will enjoy a program exploring the Snake Woman's Garden and the edible and medicinal plants at Caddo Mounds through traditional Caddo stories, time in the garden, and a short foraging adventure.
