### Lent 2018

In the Christian Century – an article caught my eye about a professor at University of Pennsylvania requires in his class called “Living Deliberately- monks, saints and contemplative life” are for a whole month the practices of an ascetic. The practices involve the body and sexuality, communication, food and appearance. They also have to journal every half hour while awake. His goal is having students not only understand what monks do and understand why they do it and the difference it makes. I share this as a way to start thinking what you planning to do differently during the 40 days of Lent. I have never found these disciplines easy to maintain nor easy to complete for the whole 40 days. St. Gregory of Nyssa – reminds us “Sin is the failure to Grow” - so we begin a season to grow – what is your plan?

In Diana Butler Bass's book, *A people's history of Christianity*. She talks about the power of the 12-step movement and she quotes a 12 stepper "The deepest and most important spiritual lessons I ever learned came from a circle of drunks, fighting desperately not to drink today, whom I initially viewed as low-life, losers, and who ultimately came to be for me the oracles of God. The Twelve steps in no way diminished my appreciation for the gospel of Jesus Christ – quite the contrary- I am more convinced than ever of the reality of the gospel story." Page 297

## WHITE GIFT 2017 -- A STELLAR YEAR

A stellar year; yes, a star-spangled goal, met! It is unbelievable what can be done with our White Gift Program. Of course, it takes the Thanksgiving Food Drive at Crossroads and Cline Elementary schools, our whole congregation, and pajamas and toys from the St. Vincent DePaul Society to do it. But, the number of people we help is huge.

This year Kriste Swanson, the Family Resource Center Coordinator of both schools, provided us with thirteen families to help, and two members of our congregation brought us two more families. So we provided gifts for twelve families and food for fifteen families totaling forty-nine children. I think that might be a record. And, with all of the food we get from the two schools plus donations from several of our members, we send food to the Bread of Life Food Pantry at St. John's Lutheran Church on Tug Fork Road, to the winter residents at Turfway Park Raceway, and to our own soup kitchen pantry. Who knows how many individuals we truly provide food for through the holidays and beyond. To provide gifts for thirty-seven children, we must thank the thirty-nine families from our congregation who picked up those little symbols from the front pew and the St. Vincent DePaul Society at St. Phillips Church for pajamas and toys as well.

Because it is such a huge undertaking for our church, it is impossible to thank every individual who provides food, money, gifts, and time; some doing more than one of these things. This program begins in late October/early November and ends the night the families pick up their gifts and food. Several teams of people work many hours to do this:

- Kriste, at the schools, selecting families for us, and teachers and student working to collect food
- a team of our members who pick up all of the food collected
- a group of people collecting boxes to house the food and gifts
- our folks setting up tables and arranging them to hold the food and gifts and putting them all back
- a team to sort the kinds of food and other items into groups
- a team to buy perishable foods and add to areas in which we need just a little more
- a team to check off the gifts and wrap extra gifts
- a team to distribute the food and gifts to the boxes for each family
- a team to help families load the food and gifts in their cars
- folks to provide a letter of invitation to St. Paul's for each family
- a team to write Thank Yous

And so, Thank You to every person who took a part in one or several of these areas. Job well done! We helped a lot of people enjoy Christmas in 2017 just a little more. God is smiling, St Paul's.
