Get to Know: Ryan Sullivan

Northway's Director of Music Ministries

Northway is pleased to welcome Ryan Sullivan as our Director of Music Ministries. Ryan began his time at Northway on July 16, and has jumped in with both feet. Already he has been a part of planning worship, providing leadership to our music ministries, and engaging with the ministerial and program staff.



Here are some things you should know about Ryan:

Ryan is currently a doctoral student in Choral Conducting at the University of North Texas, in Denton, Texas. During his time at UNT, he has conducted the A Cappella Choir, Collegium Singers, Baroque Orchestra, Men's Chorus, and taught undergraduate conducting. Additionally, he is the Assistant Conductor of the Dallas Symphony Chorus where he also works as the Chorus Administrator.

Ryan holds a M.M. in Choral Conducting from Texas Tech University and bachelor degrees in Music Education and Voice Performance from the University of Missouri - Kansas City Conservatory of Music. Before graduate school, he taught choral music at Lee's Summit H.S. and Lee's Summit West H.S. in Missouri. Ryan has also served churches in Coppell and Lubbock, Texas, as well as in Leawood, Kansas, and Lee's Summit, Missouri. He lives in Denton with his wife, Kristen, who is a student at UNT.

We recently asked Ryan a few questions to learn more about him:

- **You are in a doctoral program at UNT – what are you currently working on?**

This will be my last year of school ever, so there are a number of final projects, exams, etc. that need to be

taken care of this year. My dissertation is to produce a very large score of Vespers music from 17th century Venice. It's particularly exciting because it has not existed in modern notation ever and that means no one has heard this music in probably 300+ years. It feels a little bit like a scientist clearing away dirt to reveal dinosaur bones. I'll be conducting a performance of some selections in February with an excellent choir and orchestra from UNT. From there, I plan to get the music published so others can enjoy it. In November, my wife Kristen and I will be giving the North American premiere of the opera "Coronide"; I'm conducting and she's singing. It's great that we get to do the project together and share it with new audiences.

- **What do you like to do for fun?**

I'm lucky enough that I truly enjoy much of what I do for work, so a lot of the 'fun' is built in to my week already. I also like to exercise by swimming, cycling, and lifting. In the end, I'm a homebody who is rejuvenated by being in my living room talking to Kristen about anything and everything. I definitely 'married up.'

- **What is your favorite food?**

Breakfast is the most important and enjoyable meal of the day. I grew up on farmer-style breakfasts but have branched out to enjoy pastries, brie, etc. At a recent Northway Staff breakfast I learned about seafood for breakfast. That's next on my list.

- **Who is your favorite composer?**

Whew, that's a tough one. It's hard to compare composers from different periods because they're like apples and oranges. Claudio Monteverdi was as revolutionary a craftsman as any composer who's lived. The music of J.S. Bach has probably strengthened my love for Christ more than any composer. His dedication to his faith comes through in every passage. Johannes Brahms wrote some of the most tender music I've ever heard. A living composer who I love is Arvo Pärt because his sacred music has a serene, other-worldly sound to it. I'm always looking for new music to fall in love with. So if anyone has suggestions, send them my way.

- **What are some things on your "bucket list"?**

Kristen and I have a map of the world at home. We've marked places we've been and places where we want to travel. I very much want to see East Asia, India, the Middle East, and North Africa. I think the most extreme trip would be space/orbital tourism and I think it will be more common in my lifetime. Astronauts have said that seeing the world from 250 miles up changes your perspective on everything. That sounds good to me.

- **What excited/excites you about Northway?**

Northway Christian Church has been a wonderful new church home already. First and foremost, I am grateful to be in a place where all are truly welcome at God's table. I think it frees us to act and treat each other as children of God who are all growing. As the Director of Music, I can already tell what a richly musical congregation this is. I look out during the service and so many people are singing! Around the country, participation in musical worship is unfortunately diminishing both from the pews and by those who lead. But at Northway it's clear that people want to sing their faith and it warms my heart. A third aspect of Northway that I'm glad for is the dedication of its leadership and staff. It's very evident that there are many capable people who have the best interests of this church at heart. Transition is always a challenge, but I am confident that Northway is in great hands moving forward and I'm grateful to be a part of it!
