From the Pastor



As the commemoration of the 500th anniversary of Luther posting the 95 theses draws near it would be helpful for us all to be refreshed (reformed) in our understanding of exactly what Lutheran doctrine and theology says about Scripture, our relationship with God and living as a child of God in everyday life.

If you've read much of Luther or Lutheran theologians many Latin phrases pop up repeatedly. Latin was the official language of Luther's day and all scholarly writing was done in Latin for example, the 95 theses were posted in Latin and then quickly translated into German. So, you may have heard phrases like "Simul Justus et peccator" (simultaneously saint and sinner), or "Adiaphora" (indifferent things), "Solus Christus" (Christ alone) along with the other "solas" like Sola gratia, (grace) Sola fide, (faith) and Sola Scriptura (scripture). Other phrases like "the Righteousness of God" or "Bondage of the Will and Freedom of a Christian", "Theology of the Cross and Theology of Glory", "Law and Gospel" have for the most part dropped their Latin terminology but are important to our Lutheran understanding. If you would like to know the Latin email or text me and I'll be glad to pass them along but using them will probably label you as a "Lutheran geek."

Whether in Latin or English or whatever your native tongue is, knowing these terms is helpful. Over the next couple of month allow me to expound on these critical points of our Lutheran understanding of the faith.

Let me begin with **Law and Gospel** or *Lex et evangelium*. For Lutherans, all of God's Word can be discerned in terms of command or promise. Luther opened up the Word of God to us in ways that invite us to look at the language. He says that Christ is the subject of the verb. Christ is always the worker and the hearer is the direct object, the beneficiary of Christ's work, unconditionally – that's you and me!

Law is imperative "Do", "Don't", "you must". The Law attacks the conscience like the finger pointing directly at YOU. The Law is premised on a condition to be fulfilled. In the end, the law demands perfection. It goes beyond civil order in society and creates "isms" or ideologies

that allow no compromise or ability to negotiate. We see it in our politics left and right where it goes beyond truth and loves winning at all costs. We see it throughout life and in many relationship and particularly in the way we often try to relate with God.

Jesus didn't want people to follow Him as a way to be perfect; Christianity as the ideal social order. The Gospel is promise, spontaneous, excessive! Living in Gospel looks at reality in life and lives with the broken, the weak, and those who failed. Gospel is gift bestowed not as a possibility but a reality that is present, that is now! We see this in the parables and stories of Jesus and His interaction with others, the Samaritan, the Prodigal, the weeds & wheat, the Pharisee and the publican.

In Romans chapter 8 Paul raises the question, "What then shall separate us from the love of God in Christ Jesus?" You see, the law is demanding a response, a list of things that possibly could separate us, and Paul lists those. But then comes the gospel promise – "No, in all these things we are more than conquerors through him who loved us. For I am convinced that neither death, nor life, nor angels, nor rulers, nor things present, nor things to come, nor powers, nor height, nor depth, nor anything else in all creation, will be able to separate us from the love of God in Christ Jesus our Lord."

Luther says that the secret conviction of the heart is that the Law has the last word, that somewhere there is a recipe for life. IF you get it right... IF you do this... IF you follow this... THEN all will be well. The Gospel exposes the false word of the law- that you will never get it right. If we could, why haven't we by now? So, it's not about you, what you can or cannot do but what Christ has already done- (solus Christus).

The Gospel is BECAUSE/THEREFORE vocabulary. Because God loves you..." there is now no condemnation (Romans 8:1). Because of the cross therefore death has been defeated. CHRIST has the last word – not you or me or the Law.

A proper distinction between Law and Gospel allows us to live without fear of "have I done enough", or "I hope God accepts me", to live freely knowing that "nothing can separate us from the love of God in Christ Jesus." It is all out of my hands. It is solely (here come the "sola" words) God's work. In other words, "God's Got This!"

Whew!

Amen!

REFORMATION 500

August 13th - Inside Out: The Emotional Luther. Adults will discuss Luther's issues of anxiety and depression as well as our continued climate of secrecy regarding such ailments. Our Parish Health Specialists will help lead this workshop and share time for questions. Kids will discuss feelings and watch the movie "Inside Out" which speaks to such issues on their level.

August 27th - The Life and Times of Martin and Katie. An intergenerational event! We'll hear what was going on in the world during the Luthers' lifetimes, experience food of the time, play some historic games, learn about their daily life including what they wore and how they went to school. Pr. Betti Hazelton will share her dramatization of Katie Luther!

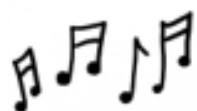
September 10th - Luther's Languages: Latin, German, Greek, and Music! We'll explore how Luther changed the church by providing scriptures and services in the language of the people and learn how much of our current worship is based on what he chose to keep of the Latin mass! We'll hear how much Luther believed in people singing together - then do just that - hymns, folk and camp songs!

September 24th - The Pope and Politics. Adults and older teens will learn about the history of the papacy and how Leo X ended up in power and causing such trouble for ML! Kids will learn what a pope is and a bit about how the church used to have such a strong control of government.

October 8th - Those 95 Theses! What were they all about anyway? Adults will focus on Luther's intent in posting the theses and what they were all about. Kids will have appropriate sessions on what Luther was about in his teaching, preaching and writing what today would have probably been on Twitter and Snapchat! And they'll explore how the printing press changed the world!

October 22nd - What Does it Mean to Be Lutheran? Appropriate sessions for adults and youth as we explore the legacy of 500 years. Who are we Lutherans and what are we supposed to be about doing today?

October 29th - **REFORMATION SUNDAY** Afternoon round table discussion on questions brought up throughout these months of learning and exploring, followed by a celebratory Reformation service and a supper. (TIMES WILL BE DIFFERENT)

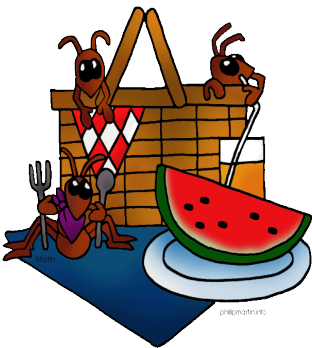

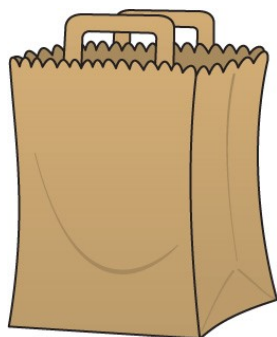

Social Ministry August Notes



The Social Ministry Committee has created a “shopping list” of suggested items needed in the food pantry. The list was created based on reviewing the pattern of items selected by those visiting the pantry. Every two weeks we will share different items for collection to stock the shelves for the specific items needed. Please understand **ALL** donations are welcome regardless of the list shared. In fact, if there are special sales going on for basic food items, we strongly urge you to take advantage of those bargains. Most of the patrons need the very *basic and easy to fix* food items.

In the coming weeks, (August dates noted) we will request on a two week collection cycle the following items. We offer the list as a convenience to you as you shop for the pantry:

Peanut butter and jelly (through August 3)

Canned fruit, canned pasta – (August 6 -August 20)

Cereal and Granola bars –(August 20 - September 3)

Flavored microwaveable side dishes (instant potatoes, rice and noodles – Lipton, Knorr, Uncle Ben’s for example

Spaghetti Sauce and Pasta

Canned meats, tuna, soups and stews

Health and beauty products (Shampoo, soap, deodorant)



Bags of Blessings will be distributed on the last Sunday of every month as a convenient reminder to take to the store as you shop. We appreciate their return for later distribution.
