Health is emerging out of the ongoing battle between influences that cause disorder and illness, and the body's resources of restoring and healing. Dr. Gloeckler will describe the main principles of illness and healing, and how they are met by Waldorf Education. Each lecture focuses on a particular condition, integrating participant questions and concerns.

**Afternoon: How do we meet the needs of the individual child?** How do we “read” the needs of the child? What tools does Waldorf Education use to support a child's health? How can we counterbalance the inclination towards eating disorders, aggression, depression, anxiety, lack of concentration and addiction? How do we manage the inclusion of special needs children?
