"How we can help the next generation know what is moral and what is good?"



We all now live in a world where there is so much false information that it can be hard to know what is true. Simply taking things at face value is not enough. We need to be able to sense more deeply, to develop moral perception. Rudolf Steiner shares that no child is born with morality, but must gather and learn this capacity anew in each lifetime. In this workshop we will look at how moral perception arises out of the physiology of the will in the small child, how we can observe patterns of moral sensing, and then work to provide experiences that are nourishing to different imbalances of moral sensing. These insights are important for the future, as the foundation of our moral life is actually formed in the first seven years.

Adam Blanning MD, practices anthroposophic medicine and works as a school doctor. He is founding faculty for the Nurturing the Roots therapeutic course, directs the anthroposophic physician training programs for the U.S., and is president of the Association for Anthroposophic Medicine and Therapies in America (AAMTA). He is also the author of a forthcoming book on understanding and observing childhood constitutional polarities, which will be published by SteinerBooks later this Spring.
