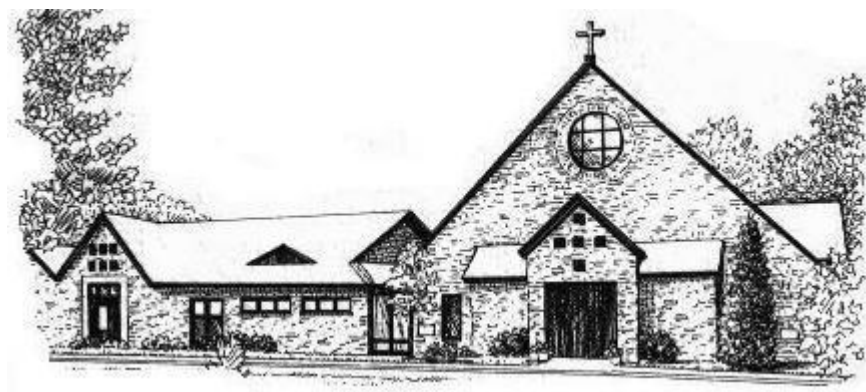

## **A Joyful Meal of Thanksgiving**

On November 18 over 125 hungry people gathered in Sutherland and Shoemaker Halls to enjoy together a traditional Thanksgiving feast—food offered to our community by All Saints’ and prepared by our neighbors and Neighbors Table Partners, the cooks of New Prospect Baptist. Since 2012 our two churches have joined forces and prepared this special Holiday meal. Many from All Saints’ were involved: Turkey Cooks and Carvers (13 big birds), Dessert Makers (an abundance of pumpkin, chocolate, and fruit pies, plus Eva’s Famous Brownies), Flower Arrangers, Nursery Staff, and the hard-working Parishioners who set up almost every table and chair we possess, took them down, and then cleaned up after the meal.

But maybe the happiest place last Saturday was the big church kitchen—where several parishioners served as “kitchen hosts” and got to observe first-hand the creative work of the NT Team from New Prospect and enjoy their good company.

Several years ago Bishop Larry Maze visited All Saints’ to lead a retreat on a Saturday. The Bishop looked out over Sutherland Hall where NT guests were eating their meal and commented “This is the Holy Eucharist.” It felt that way on November 18.

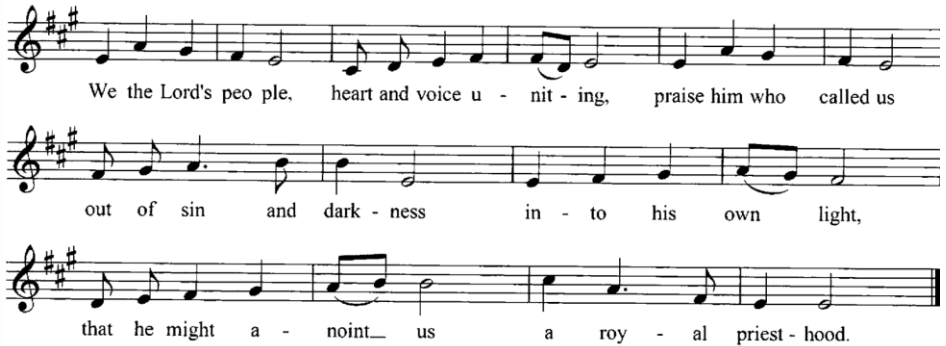
