APOLLO DISTRICT INTERPRETIVE PROGRAMS April 2017

WEDNESDAY 5TH, 12TH AND 26TH -- 10:00 AM - "CANOE MOSQUITO LAGOON"

Reservations will be accepted a week before the canoe date. Join a guide as you explore this rich and diverse estuary up close. Some experience is preferred. You must be at least 8 years old and able to paddle. You must wear covered shoes (no sandals or flip-flops). Bring water, sunscreen and a hat. Dress to get wet. Meet at the Visitors Information Center at 9:45 a.m. We will leave promptly at 10:00 a.m. (2 hours)

SATURDAY 15TH -- 3:00 PM "CANAVERAL'S BEACH HABITATS" Walk on the beach and discover the different plant and animal habitats. Meet at the Visitor Center at 3 PM. (1 hour)

SATURDAY 22ND – 9:00 AM – “EARTH DAY BEACH AND LAGOON CLEAN-UP” Celebrate Earth Day by helping to clean Apollo Beach and Mosquito Lagoon. Bring water, sunscreen, bug repellent, work gloves and a hat. We provide trash bags. Meet at the Visitor Center. (3 hours)
