**THURSDAY, 1<sup>ST</sup>, 8<sup>TH</sup>, 15<sup>TH</sup> – 10:00 AM “PHOTO WALK”** – Explore the seashore through the view finder. We will compose a picture. Discover the diversity and beauty of the various plants and animals inhabiting the barrier island. Bring your camera, water, sunscreen and repellent. Meet at Playalinda Beach. Exact location posted at the entrance station. (1 hour)

**FRIDAY, 2<sup>ND</sup> & 16<sup>TH</sup> – 1:00 PM “SEMINOLE REST TOUR”** – Take a walk through the historic home known as Seminole Rest. See the site of two historic houses built on a prehistoric Indian shell mound or midden, components of which date as early as second millennium BC. Meet at the main house. (30-40 min.)

**FRIDAY, 9<sup>TH</sup> – 10:00 AM “PLAYALINDA BEACH CLEAN-UP”** – Join a park ranger on this beautiful beach and help keep our shorelines trash free. Bring gloves, water and sunscreen. Trash bags will be provided. Meet at parking area 1 (1 hour)

**FRIDAY, 16<sup>TH</sup> - 10:00 AM “SEMINOLE REST PHOTO WALK”** - Explore the beautiful grounds once inhabited by the Timucua and search for photo opportunities. Meet in the parking area. (1 hour)
