APOLLO DISTRICT INTERPRETIVE PROGRAMS February 2017

PLEASE NOTE: *all programs are subject to cancellation and/or rescheduling* due to staff limitations, weather conditions, or other factors. Entrance fees apply to all interpretive program participants. All programs meet the requirements for the Canaveral National Seashore Junior Ranger program.

WEDNESDAY 1ST, 8TH AND 22ND – “PLANTS OF THE PARK” Join us for a series of plant walks to learn how the plants in the park were used by Native Americans and early settlers and see their unique botanical characteristics and areas of adaptation. The first walk on the 1st meets at parking lot #8 at 10 AM to walk the Eldora loop trail (2 hours). The second walk on the 8th meets at parking lot #3 at 10 AM to walk the Castle Windy trail (2 hours). The third walk on the 22nd meets at parking lot #9 at 10 AM to do a loop walk (2 hours) meets.

SATURDAY 4TH – 1:00 PM -- “COASTAL WATERSHED MODEL” Join a ranger-led program to learn about water pollution and the Indian River Lagoon system. Learn where all the pollution comes from, why pollution is harmful, and how to prevent pollution while utilizing an interactive 3D model of a watershed. Be prepared to get your hands dirty. We will be using non-toxic household food items such as cocoa powder to represent various pollutants that commonly enter the waterways. Meet at the Visitor Center. (1½ hour)

WEDNESDAY 1ST, 8TH AND 22ND -- 10:00 AM - “CANOE MOSQUITO LAGOON” Reservations will be accepted a week before the canoe date. Join a guide as you explore this rich and diverse estuary up close. Some experience is preferred. You must be at least 8 years old and able to paddle. You must wear covered shoes (no sandals or flip-flops). Bring water, sunscreen and a hat. Dress to get wet. Individuals with their own kayaks or canoes are welcome to join in. Call (386) 428-3384 ext. 0 to reserve your spot. Meet at the Visitors Information Center at 9:45 a.m. We will leave promptly at 10:00 a.m. (2 hours)

A park guide will be on board to point out different species as they appear. Our comfortable pontoon boat, *Tortuga del Sol*, and our licensed captains and experienced mates are trained to provide you with a memorable and safe tour. Join us as we depart from the Visitor Center at 10 a.m., weather permitting. **RESERVATIONS ARE REQUIRED** and **SPACE IS LIMITED**. A cost recovery fee of \$20.00 per person is charged. Programs will be held at the Apollo Visitor Center outdoor pavilion, weather permitting, or inside the auditorium if there is inclement weather. (1 hour)

THURSDAY 16TH – 1:00 PM - “PINE NEEDLE BASKET WEAVING” Learn the ancient art of pine needle basket weaving. This is great for beginners or those looking to brush up on their skills. The materials will be provided, just bring your imagination. Meet at the Visitor Center. (1 hour)

TUESDAY 21ST – 1:00 PM – “ESTUARIES: SEEING THE UNSEEN” Explore the unseen world of microscopic plankton from Mosquito Lagoon. Learn about the importance of Estuaries and the role of plankton within the Estuary. Capture plankton samples with a plankton net, and view them through a microscope inside the Visitor Center. Meet at the Visitor Center at 10:00 a.m. (2 hours)
