THURSDAY 6th & 20th -10:00 AM - “CAST NETTING AT PLAYALINDA” – Join a ranger and learn the art of cast netting. See how to catch bait and what may be caught in this area of Mosquito Lagoon. Meet at Eddy Creek parking area. (1 hour)

SUNDAY 9th – 10:00 AM - “BEACH CLEAN-UP” – Join a ranger and help keep our shorelines clean. Bring water, sunscreen, bug repellent, work gloves and a hat. We provide trash bags. Meet at parking area #1. (1 hour)

THURSDAY 13th – 10:00 AM - “LET’S GET CRABBING” – Join a ranger and try your luck crabbing from the shore of Mosquito Lagoon. Bring water, sunscreen, and bug spray. Meet at Eddy Creek parking area. (1 hour)

FRIDAY, 14th & 28th – 9:00 AM - “COASTAL PHOTO WALK” – Explore the seashore through the view finder. We will compose a picture. Discover the diversity and beauty of the various plants and animals inhabiting the barrier island. Bring your camera, water, sunscreen and repellent. Meet at Eddy Creek parking area. (1 hour)

SUNDAY, 23rd – 3:00 PM -“CHANCE-URBAN CHAMBER MUSIC” – Join us for a free “narrative concert” in celebration of the centennial of the National Park Service and Canaveral National Seashore. “John Muir – University of the Wilderness” is a “narrative concert” which intertwines the music of the American ensemble “Chance”, and the writings of Scottish born naturalist, John Muir. His words are celebrated, reflected upon, and reinforced by a nature forged musical score that they describe as: “a place where contemporary, classical, and Celtic music beautifully collide”.
