

Students Selected to Represent KDS at the 127th Continental Congress

After an intensive selection process, Bailee Chandler and Brayden Lewis were chosen to represent KDS during the National Society Daughters of the American Revolution's 127th Annual Continental Congress in Washington, D.C., this June. All KDS Juniors were invited to apply for this honor. Applicants' names were passed on to a nominating committee, resulting in nine finalists who were interviewed.

Once the interviews concluded, and after much debate, a selection committee made up of members of the KDS Executive Committee, Administrative Staff, and High School faculty chose Bailee and Brayden as the 2018 KDS representatives.

KDS junior **Brayden Lewis** is the 17-year-old son of Mandy and Benji Lewis. He has been a student at KDS since Kindergarten.
