School Uniform Matters – Dear ICS Parents,

A dedicated group of parents and teachers met to discuss modernizing the school uniform. A survey was sent out to parents with a great response rate, and after a few hours of discussion and debate, the following decisions were made. Thank you for all of the feedback!

There will be no changes to the dress uniform. A hoodie is being phased in for the gym crewneck sweatshirt. There will be a transition period of (2) years where students can wear their previously purchased crewneck sweatshirts. We strongly encourage you to purchase the hoodie, as the crew neck sweatshirts are no longer offered on the Flynn and O'Hara website as an option.

Grades one through four girls will now have a warm weather skort available in the blackwatch pattern as an alternative to the jumper. This will only be worn during the autumn and spring months where the students can have the option of shorts.

A hunter green polo shirt will now be offered as an option for the boys and girls daily uniform, since nearly 80% of respondents reacted very positively to this change. The white polo will still be an option for the daily uniform. Thank you to everyone who took the time to meet and/or give feedback.
