KEY PROGRAM

COMPONENTS

SCHOOL BASED PRACTICUM COHORTS

School Based Practicum Cohorts: Participants will be together in cohorts of approximately 25, learning key concepts and skills that will help them as they prepare for their classrooms. At these schools, Site Managers will provide scheduled time for participants to observe classroom practices and support individual or small groups of students.

SELF-SELECTED STUDY

Candidates will be able to choose from 3 intensive sessions, determining for themselves which areas of their practice they would like to grow and develop.

PROFESSIONAL DEVELOPMENT

By the end of each intensive, participants will not only have knowledge and skills that will help them in their classrooms, but will also have a wealth of experiences to add to their professional portfolios, along with key experiences to be added to their resumes. Sessions are strategically held during hours that will allow participants to conduct demo lessons during summer school hours, or attend evening hiring fair events.

APPLICATION REQUIREMENTS

In order to apply to our Summer Intensives, each applicant **must meet the following qualifications:**

- Submit a New Teacher Application at www.teachnyc.net
- Complete an NYCMT 5 minute application at <https://goo.gl/hvFneK>.
- Be at or near certification necessary to be a full time teacher in September

Application and Deadlines

All those who are interested in Summer Intensives must submit both a New Teacher Application *and* NYCMT Summer Intensives application according to the schedule listed below.

May 30th for July 9th-July 19th sessions

June 20th for July 23rd-August 2nd sessions

Compensation

Summer Intensives will be work; and for that reason, participants will be compensated at a rate of \$600 a week. Full completion of the Intensive workshops is mandatory in order to receive this stipend. Participants should expect to receive their stipends within 3 weeks of completing an Intensive. *Note: these stipends will not be taxed.*

RESPONSIBILITIES

SESSION TOPICS AND SCHEDULE

Summer Intensives will run from July 9th-August 2nd, with a culminating celebration on August 3rd. Participants will choose from 3 different topics:

- Setting Up Your Classroom and Building Relationships (2 weeks)
- Lesson Planning and Engagement (2 weeks)
- Teaching the Whole Student (1 week)

Sessions will be held in a NYC public school.

PARTICIPATION

Summer Intensive participants are expected to attend the entire length of their session, Monday-Thursday from 1-4pm. During this time, participants will conduct readings, discuss key topics, practice key skills, and observe strong practices. A culminating project will be completed at the end of the Intensive.

PARTNERSHIP

Collaboration with peers is a key component to the success of the Institute. As each participant will come with a variety of skills, experiences, and mindsets, a considerable amount of the work will be collaborative, so that participants can learn from each other.
