



The American Civil Liberties Union Foundation of Southern California (ACLU SoCal) Jails Project works to ensure that a basic standard of care is provided to people in jail. The Jails Project's Unlock the Vote (UTV) along with other community partners are embarking on a campaign to reduce barriers to registration and voting for justice-involved and justice-impacted folks in Los Angeles County as well as Orange County.

- To go inside the jail facilities to educate and register*,
- At the visitors line to educate and register family and friends,

- To attend reentry fairs to educate and register people who are CJ-impacted,

This is needed for the LA Sheriff's Department's background check. Include if you speak any other languages, besides English and what days/times you are available to volunteer. Also you must attend a **mandatory** training.

- Custody Training (LASD): 2 hours, this includes the mandated PREA training

We also have opportunities to volunteer with our OC Jails work, which includes:

- Mailing voter education and registration information,
- Educating and registering recently released individuals at the jails between 10PM-3AM,
- And much more.
