Building an Image

Most great images are not spontaneous. They are more often well thought out and carefully crafted, taking in to consideration such things as what you choose to include in the frame, lighting, the background, perspective and many other elements. In this talk, Steve goes through his entire process. From seeing and identifying the image, to choosing the message and the step by step progression of building the final composition.

Perches are arranged at the edge of a large field, with a great deal of attention given to props, animals and backgrounds. The workshop is under the direction of Steve Gettle, a nationally known, well published, professional nature photographer. Steve donates his time and knowledge of the fine art of nature photography to benefit the participants and the Howell Nature Center Wildlife Education and Rehabilitation Departments.

Each workshop will last four to five hours and includes a great lunch!

Arrive at 11:00 am for an hour long presentation and discussion session with Steve.

Arrive at 9:45 am for a guided tour of our Wild Wonders Wildlife Park for an additional fee.

Photographers of all skill levels are welcome, but please, have working knowledge of your equipment.
