Our High Adventure Program at the Howell Nature Center aims to empower you and adults through engaging experiences that assist participants in the understanding of themselves and their relationship to others. The growth of this exciting program has enabled us to reach even more nature lovers and thrill seekers. With the addition of many new high ropes and zip line elements over the years, we have something for everyone!

As we begin 2017, the Challenge staff (as we like to call our High adventure facilitators) are gearing up and getting excited for this year's new High Adventure Programs. The two newest elements are Giant Swing and Triple Experience.

The Giant Swing is an adventure unlike any other! You will gear up and be lifted in the air up to 40 feet! When you are ready to swing, you will release yourself, to start swinging through the sky. If you would like to see the giant swing in action check out our YouTube Channel, just search "Howell Nature Center" on YouTube, to get a better look!

Second, the Triple Experience is a combination of our zip lines, our sixty foot climbing tower, and the giant swing. To start, you will get the opportunity to climb one of the tallest outdoor climbing towers in the state of Michigan. After that we will lead you to our longest zip lines on property, both zips are 500 feet long! Finally we will take you to the Giant Swing where you will fly through the air after being lifted 40 feet into the trees! The Triple Experience is great for those who want a full day of action.

The High Adventure season begins March 25! Howell Nature Center provides many High Adventure Programming options including Zip Lines, Zip Tours, High and Low Ropes Courses, as well as one of Michigan's tallest outdoor climbing towers. The Howell Nature Center has some beautiful spots on our property! This list surely does not include the waterfront! Don't get me wrong we have a beautiful lake, and in the right lighting our swimming dock looks gorgeous, but our waterfront is something that needs some help!

When I began here in 1978, Pleasant Lake (which is a shallow flat bottom lake with no deep holes and sits on the water table) wasn't much more than a big, mucky mud puddle. After investing in weed control, a deep water well, and help from Mother Nature, we have turned that big puddle into a really nice lake full of fish, turtles and other wildlife.

Over the years we have also developed a small but nice swimming area (pictured here), but with our growth over the years, it's time to really make this area a place not only for better swimming but also relaxing on lovely decks and truly enjoying the beauty that Pleasant Lake has to offer. We recently developed plans that would increase the outdoor sitting with beautiful observation decks, a way to address the erosion issue that currently exists, and protocols for revamping the swimming area to be safer, and more enjoyable for swimmers.

The cost for the entire project is about \$90,000 and to date we have raised almost half of the money needed! WILD ABOUT SPRING!

Winter can be a quiet time for many departments at the Howell Nature Center but not for the Wildlife Program! For 365 days a year, our staff and volunteers in both Wild Wonders and the Wildlife Rehabilitation Clinic are coming in to care for animals, clean enclosures and keep them all warm and comfortable. We don't have time to hibernate!

All winter the Wildlife Clinic continues to get injured adult birds and mammals from across Michigan. Some patients, like turtles, cranes, vultures and songbirds, who were still recovering from their injuries at the time of hibernation/migration, must be overwintered. Others come in with new injuries or emaciation and frostbite brought on by our harsh Michigan weather. Among our many patients this winter were a great horned owl caught in a leg-hold trap, an emaciated horned grebe, a barred owl with a wrist injury and an adult coyote caught in a fence. And now it's time to gear up for SPRING!

For the Wildlife Rehabilitation Clinic, that means hundreds of orphaned babies will soon be arriving. We were fortunate to get a grant from the Community Foundation of Greater Flint to build a new waterfowl caging system outside the clinic. This will help alleviate the overcrowding we experienced last year...we took in over 500 ducklings in the month of June alone!

In Wild Wonders, we are getting ready for the thousands of visitors who arrive with the warmer temperatures. Our ambassadors who would normally hibernate or migrate are coming back outside from their warmer winter indoor housing. The grounds are being raked and the exhibits are getting a deep cleaning. We have also begun construction on our new Flying Squirrel Habitat as our 5 residents will be moving out of the Nature Zone.

The Nature Scape and Tree House are also getting some exciting new additions for 2017. Coming soon: Nature Backpacks that can be borrowed for some on-site kid-friendly nature exploration. These will include binoculars, magnifying glasses, field guides, butterfly nets and more. Look for the Nature Scape to open toward the end of April! Happy Spring!
