As 2016 comes to a close, the Wildlife Program at the Howell Nature Center is taking a deep breath. This year has been like no other. To date, we have taken in over 3,100 wild animals for care, a 30% increase over any previous year. By August, we were out of funding, resources, energy and the room to shelter more. For the first time, we were forced to publicly announce that our clinic was temporarily closed to any new suffering animals.

Thanks to a heartwarming response from caring people like you, our Wildlife Clinic is back open again. While this year presented exceptional challenges, few people realize that the Wildlife Clinic struggles EVERY year to provide this important community service. These animals have no owner to pay for their care and we receive no government funding. It is an ongoing and uphill battle and the desperate need will only continue to increase in the future.

- Updated and added two exciting new elements in our High Adventure Program

2016 will definitely be looked at as not only the year where we saw a record amount of guests and “wildlife patients” but a year where we were able to start to build for the future. So what is the future you ask? Some tasks ahead for 2017.....

- Because of the increase in usage our buildings will need some much needed maintenance and updates to keep up in “like new” condition
- Some improvements in wildlife care facilities is also badly needed to keep up with the added amount of wildlife coming to us for help
- Some infrastructure improvements to driveways, parking areas, and other areas as well
- Improvements to the waterfront area; with better swimming, additional seating and erosion control is planned

In closing, these are just a few major items on our list for 2017, speaking of daunting.....it is.....but with the continued assistance of our outstanding supporters such as yourself, we will make it a reality!

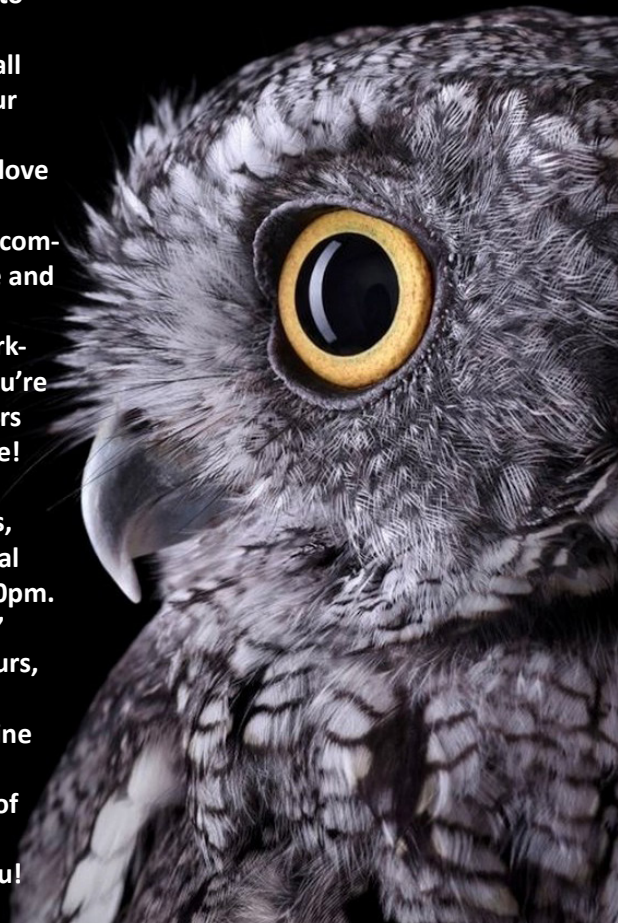

In the 50 years that the Howell Nature Center has been around we have strived to provide experiences in nature. We developed a benchmark based Environmental Education Programming selection that coincides with the teaching standards of the state of Michigan. The ability to take a subject taught in school and take it outdoors to make it fun, personal, and educational is what makes this group of programs unique. Hundreds of school aged children visit the nature each year to participate in our Environmental Education Programs. Whether they come for a day or an overnight camp, our programming is beloved by these schools. Most of our schools visit either in the spring or the fall. They come from all over the state of Michigan, as well as neighboring states like Illinois, Indiana, and Ohio.

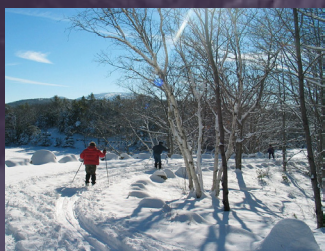
Our 60+ Environmental Education and Wildlife Programs include topics such as Pond Study, Nature Hikes, and live animal presentations. Educational tours of our Wild Wonders Wildlife Park provide exciting, and up close exposure to the natural world around us. We are also one of only four Heifer International Global Village Training Centers in the USA. The Global Village aims to educate students and adults alike about the causes and effects of hunger and poverty, and to empower those individuals to make a difference the lives of people in their own communities, and around the world.

Groups that visit also choose to engage in the offerings of our High Adventure and Challenge Department. With many options such as High Ropes, Climbing Tower and our 7 zip line course. We also offer Outdoor Education activities such as archery, canoeing and survival skills round out the camp experience. During our 2016 Spring/Fall Season we hosted a total of 14,214 school children, which has grown from 12,000 children in 2015. Every season brings us 5-10 brand new schools. They come to join the many that are already learning and discovering what The Howell Nature Center has to offer. We hope to see you or your school soon!

Here at the Howell Nature Center we are proud to foster growth in people of all ages and from all walks of life. Whether our guests experience personal growth by overcoming a fear of heights, learning about Michigan's wild animals, or even by making a new friend at a Scout event, we're happy to have been a part of that moment.

Through our Scouting Program, Cub Scouts and Girl Scouts have many opportunities to earn badges and learn new skills from our knowledgeable staff. One hundred and fifty Scouts joined us at our Fall Badge Workshops, earning up to eight different badges. These badges covered a range of topics, from geology to archeology, trees to campcraft (knot tying, fire-building, and similar activities).

We have many more opportunities for our Scouts to discover and grow with in 2017. On January 20 and February 3, Cadette Girl Scouts can join us for Cadette Owl Nights. In this evening program, Scouts enjoy a live owl presentation, then go outside to listen for owls calling through the woods. By the end of the program girls will have satisfied requirements one through four of the Cadette Night Owl Badge.

On February 25, we're offering a brand new program to Cub and Girl Scouts of all ages. During our Winter Skills Workshop, we'll cross country ski, go sledding, and learn about Michigan's native wildlife. Back inside, Scouts can explore their creative sides with our arts and crafts tables, and practice for our all-Scout skit performances.
