

Keynote Speaker: Bill Dunlap



William Dunlap has distinguished himself as an artist, arts commentator and educator, during a career that has spanned more than three decades. His paintings, sculpture and constructions are included in prestigious collections, such as the Metropolitan Museum of Art, Lauren Rogers Museum, Rogers Ogden Collection, Arkansas Art Center, and United States Embassies

throughout the world. He has had solo exhibitions at the Corcoran Gallery of Art, National Academy of Science, Aspen Museum of Art, Southeastern Center for Contemporary Art, Mississippi Museum of Art, Contemporary Art Center in New Orleans, to name but a few.

Honored in his field, Mr. Dunlap has received awards and fellowships from the Rockefeller Foundation, the Lila Wallace/Reader's Digest Foundation for study and travel in Southeast Asia, Warhol Foundation, Virginia Commission for the Arts, Mississippi Institute of Arts and Letters, Southeastern Center for Contemporary Art/RJR Nabisco Visual Artists Award, and the Mississippi Governor's Award for Excellence in the Arts. He is an inspired speaker and has lectured on art related subjects at colleges, universities, institutions and professional conferences. He serves as arts commentator on WETA-TV's cultural round table show, "Around Town." William Dunlap has an M.F.A. from the University of Mississippi, and taught at Appalachian State University in North Carolina (1970-79) and Memphis State University (1979-80.) He currently maintains studios in McLean, Virginia; Mathiston, Mississippi and Coral Gables, Florida.

Mixed Media

Come join our featured speaker for an insightful look into his creative process. Participants will create works with Dunlap that explore a Sense of Place. Limit 15 participants.



Photography

Justin Reeves in a noted area photographer and art educator who strives to bring real-world applicable information and insight to his classroom. Participants will create fabulous photographs and learn techniques to take back to their own classrooms. A digital camera or smartphone is required, and a laptop for editing is preferred. Limit 15 participants.



Batik

Veteran teacher Vicky Miley will facilitate this centuries old process using a wax resist process on fabric. Create your own batik with dyes and jaunting tools in this workshop and gain strategies to implement the processes into your own classroom. Limit 15 participants.



Registration Information

Conference fees include Friday and Saturday sessions, art supplies needed for the sessions, conference t-shirt or tote bag, coffee and muffins Friday morning, dinner Friday evening, and lunch on Saturday. The Thursday studio concentrations are an additional \$50 which includes some art supplies. All sessions are specifically geared to help Visual Arts teachers strengthen their teaching practices and show connections to the Visual Arts Standards as well as give teachers opportunities to reflect, problem solve, and share new ideas and experiences. Up to 2 CEUs or 20 contact hours are available during this professional development conference.
