secondary athletics, all of us honing our disciplines through the Wolves club program graduating to college before representing GPRC in the ACAC or beyond. I bring up sports for a few reasons. I learned teamwork, discipline, winning humbly, losing graciously, the prep work that is put in before the game starts, and many other lessons I feel are best realized through sport. My aptitude for sports opened many doors and presented many opportunities to me. For that I am thankful.
