<div><div><input type="checkbox"/> Develop a vision for life after high school - college, employment options, community inclusion, life skills, leisure, recreation, social networks, housing, etc.</div><div><input type="checkbox"/> Network with others who have experienced transition or are currently in transition planning.</div><div><input type="checkbox"/> Build goals into IEP that link to the future vision - focus on skill building and experiences that will be important in adult years (e.g. employability skills, social skills and connections, functional academic skills, etc.).</div><div><input type="checkbox"/> Review Post Secondary Programs &amp; eligibility and entrance criteria – use this info when planning IEP goals</div><div><input type="checkbox"/> Learn life, banking &amp; bus skills at home and in community. Consider this info when planning IEP goals</div><div><input type="checkbox"/> Consider work &amp;/or volunteer possibilities. School district - ask school staff for information about the Douglas College/School District Transitions program as a possible option for grade 12 and 12+ year.</div><div><input type="checkbox"/> Review Post Secondary Programs; clarify college entry requirements and eligibility criteria. (at age 19 parents are no longer their child’s legal guardians).
