

NAZARENE DISASTER RESPONSE



On January 22, Mayon Volcano in the province of Albay in the Philippines erupted with heavy ashfall. Around 80,000 people were evacuated after lava and ashes came out of the crater. The eruption has destroyed 95 million dollars in crops, affecting at least 9,791 farmers and over 17,000 acres of land.

The Church of the Nazarene through the **Nazarene Disaster Response** and **Nazarene Compassionate Ministries**

continue to be in the frontline by helping provide assistance to 5 evacuation centers around the city, giving away 2,000 Crisis Care Kits (CCKs) to 2,000 families.

There is an increased need for relief goods and health-related supplies like dust masks and medicines to help the people in the evacuation center. The government estimated the volcanic activity may last up to 4 months or until the volcano remains active.
