Blackland Prairie Nature Preserve Field Trip

Meet at 9:00am at the prairie. We will explore this 10 acre Blackland Prairie remnant, acquired and preserved by the City of Arlington. Here are some of the expected flora at the site: Prairie Bishop (*Bifora americana*), Two Flower Milkvine (*Matelea biflora*), Indian Plantain (*Arnoglossum plantagineum*), Old Plainsman (*Hymenopappus scabiosaeus* var. *corymbosus*), Yellow Star (*Lindheimera texana*), Prairie Groundsel (*Packera plattensis*), Sleepy Catchfly (*Silene antirrhina*), Common St. John's Wort (*Hypericum perforatum*), Sensitive Briar (*Mimosa roemeriana*), Prairie Celestial (*Nemastylis geminiflora*), Trailing Ratany (*Krameria lanceolata*), White Prairie Larkspur (*Delphinium carolinianum* ssp. *virescens*), Purple Paintbrush (*Castilleja purpurea*) and Prairie Bluets (*Stenaria nigricans*).

Chalk Mountain Ranch Field Trip

Meet at 8:30am in Glen Rose at the Brookshire's parking lot. We will travel from there to stop and see a recently discovered rare plant species for North Texas near Glen Rose. From there, we will head on to Chalk Mountain Ranch. This will be a hike in easy to moderate terrain, up to 2 miles. Please bring plenty of water. It is optional, but the plan afterwards will be to eat at Hammonds BBQ in Glen Rose.

Here's a small sampling of what you might expect to see: Plateau Milk Vine (*Matelea edwardsensis*), Plains Fleabane (*Erigeron modestus*), Gray Golden Aster (*Heterotheca*

canescens), Barbara's Buttons (*Marshallia caespitosa* var. *signata*), Slender Greenthread (*Thelesperma simplicifolium*), Pineapple Cactus (*Coryphantha sulcata*), Pink Mimosa (*Mimosa borealis*), Engelmann Sage (*Salvia engelmannii*), Rock Flax (*Linum rupestre*), Thin Leaf Brookweed (*Samolus valerandi* ssp. *parviflorus*) and Gray Vervain (*Verbena canescens*).

Thora Hart Park Hike Saturday, April 29, 2017

Join us for a stroll through this excellent 10 acre example of Eastern Cross Timbers Post Oak and Blackjack woodlands, with scattered prairie openings. The park may look like the typical city owned park from the street, but many treasures can be found in such a small natural area. To date, 678 observations, including 205 plant species, have been made through the iNaturalist app.

Here is a sample of what you might expect to see in April: Silver Evax (*Diaperia candida*), Carolina False Dandelion (*Pyrrhopappus carolinianus*), Venus' Looking Glass (*Triodanis perfoliata*), Rusty Blackhaw (*Viburnum rufidulum*), Western Spiderwort (*Tradescantia occidentalis*), Nuttall's Wild Indigo (*Baptisia nuttalliana*), Edible Scurf Pea (*Pediomelum hypogaeum* var. *scaposum*), Bracted Zornia (*Zornia bracteata*), Cut Leaf Evening Primrose (*Oenothera laciniata*), Slender Yellow Woodsorrel (*Oxalis dilleniid*), Wright's Plantain (*Plantago wrightiana*), Hair Grass (*Aira elegans*), Woolly Rosette Grass (*Dichanthelium acuminatum*), Engelmann's Dock (*Rumex hastatulus*), Cherry Laurel (*Prunus caroliniana*), Eastern Hercules Club (*Zanthoxylum clava-herculis*), Toad Flax (*Nuttallanthus canadensis*), Beardtongue (*Penstemon laxiflorus*) and Stinging Nettle (*Urtica chamaedryoides*).

Join us on this trip to this excellent example of an ancient Western Cross Timbers Post Oak/Blackjack Oak woodlands, with scattered prairie openings. The topography is hilly, with elevations from 920 feet at the bottom of the hill at the lake during normal pool, to 1050 feet at the top of the hillside.

The soils are mostly developed on Pennsylvanian strata with rocks and gravel at the surface. On slopes and along the ridges lie numerous boulders, carpeted with ferns, mosses and lichens. There are 10 different species of ferns present on the property: Mosquito Fern (*Azolla caroliniana*), Ebony Spleenwort (*Asplenium platyneuron*), Common Woodsia (*Woodsia obtusa*), Grape Fern (*Botrychium virginianum*), Engelmann's Adder's Tongue (*Ophioglossum engelmannii*), Star Scaled Cloak Fern (*Astrolepis integerrima*), Alabama Lip Fern (*Myriopteris alabamensis*=*Cheilanthes*), Wooly Lip Fern (*Myriopteris tomentosa*=*Cheilanthes*), Purple Cliff Brake (*Pellaea atropurpurea*) and Wright's Cliff Brake (*Pellaea wrightiana*).

Ray Roberts Lake State Park - Isle du Bois Unit Field Trip

Saturday, May 27, 2017

Meet at 9:00 inside the entrance at the parking lot. A \$7.00 entrance fee applies.

Join us for a unique look at one of the Metroplex's most diverse habitats, where an ecotone between the Eastern Cross Timbers, the Blackland Prairie and the Fort Worth Prairie support uncommon and rare plant communities. There are many species present here which extend out of the Blackland Prairie to the east, and from sandy alfisol prairies to the northeast.

Here is an assortment of the flora of Isle du Bois Unit: Rattlesnake Master (*Eryngium yuccifolium*), Dogbane (*Apocynum cannabinum*), Side Cluster Milkweed (*Asclepias oenotheroides*), Butterfly Weed (*Asclepias tuberosa*), Ebony Spleenwort (*Asplenium platyneuron*), Lanceleaf Coreopsis (*Coreopsis lanceolata*), Pale Coneflower (*Echinacea pallida*), Ashy Sunflower (*Helianthus mollis*), Rough Coneflower (*Liatris aspera*), Kansas Gayfeather (*Liatris pycnostachya*), Seep Barbara's Buttons (*Marshallia caespitosa* var. *caespitosa*), Giant Coneflower (*Rudbeckia maxima*), Compass Plant (*Silphium laciniatum*), Rough Stem Rosenweed (*Silphium radula*), Gravelweed Crownbeard (*Verbesina helianthoides*), Bejar Marbleseed (*Onosmodium bejariense*), Sicklepod (*Borodinia canadensis*=*Arabis*), Georgia Sunrose (*Helianthemum georgianum*), Spotted St. John's Wort (*Hypericum punctatum*), Plains Wild Indigo (*Baptisia bracteata*), Nuttall's Wild Indigo (*Baptisia nuttalliana*), Yellow Bush Pea (*Baptisia sphaerocarpa*), White Prairie Clover (*Dalea candida* var. *candida*),

Narrowleaf Mountain Mint (*Pycnanthemum tenuifolium*), Maypop (*Passiflora incarnata*), Pink Milkwort (*Polygala incarnata*) and Tube Penstemon (*Penstemon tubiflorus*).
