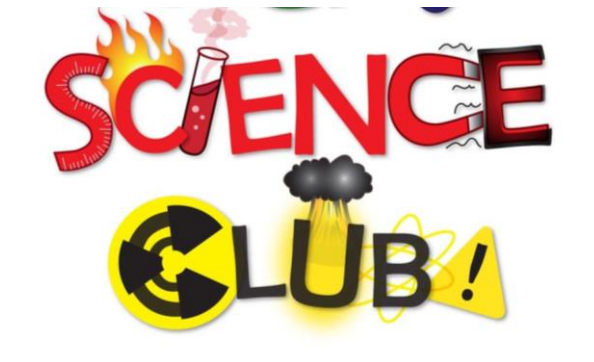

Lego Club has also included after school field trips such as going to Chunky's Cinema to see the *Lego Movie* and trips to LEGOLAND in Somerville.

The Camera Club offer students the opportunity to learn the techniques of using a camera. Each session has a lesson on photographic topics such as composing a photograph, portraits, still life, black light/fluorescent subjects, action photography, and using set ups. Participants try their hand at taking photos. While Shutterbugs teaches the skill of taking photographs, it is meant to be enjoyable, too. Subjects and set ups are determined by student interest. We have also taken field trips to Nubble Light in York, ME and the Sone Zoo/Lynnfells Parkway to photograph Christmas lights. This year, Ms. Cocchiaro would like to have student photographers documenting school events. We are also looking at adding a video component this year. We offer a fall and Spring session. Students can be at varying levels from beginners to advance. Each student should have a camera that requires a memory card. Shutterbugs are best for students in grades 4-8.
