ACTS

Caring for one another is the heart of what it means to be in koinonia, a community in Christ. In January 2014 we began a new pastoral care model, ACTS (Actively Caring Through Sharing) based on a successful program pioneered by Trinity Church, Staunton. Gail Dick and Sharon

Massie head this effort. We have five teams that are on call for one week at a time. The teams call, visit, send a card or sometimes provide a meal or ride to a parishioner or friend of the parish who is homebound or in need because of a health concern or life event. These teams are not intended to take the place of clergy but to supplement and enrich our caring for each other. Grace ACTS is an important in-reach to the parishioners and the community of our church. We have over 30 people or family units that volunteer for the Grace ACTS ministry. Please continue to pray for this vital ministry to our parish. Landscaping Project
