Questions to the Confirmands

(Brett Johnson) Your parents and grandparents passed this faith on to you. In many cases they baptized you as infants making the promises of faith on your behalf. But now you are older, and the choice to enter into a life long relationship with God in following Christ becomes your decision as the disciple God has called you to be. Each of you has studied the Christian faith, you have also learned about the different teachings and traditions of worship throughout the church and in other faith traditions. You have worked to understand what confirming belief in Jesus Christ as Lord and Savior of your lives means and what it may cost you to follow Jesus in your life as a disciple. Is it your desire to continue in a life long relationship with Jesus the Christ? If this is your desire this day – please respond:

Confirmands: I have weighed the cost, and I seek to be a disciple of Jesus Christ.

(Dena Provenzano) You have also learned what it is to be the church, not as a building but as a people. Each of you possesses different talents, gifts, and personalities. You have learned and seen the power of God at work among you. Together we share our lives and our faith in knowing that we do not take this journey alone. Is it your desire to be an active and visible part of First Congregational United Church of Christ? Will you live for faith as best as you are able to be an ambassador for Jesus that in hearing, seeing and witnessing to your life others might see Jesus visible in you?

(Pastor Kim) The life and teachings of Jesus are not easily followed. This walk with God will require much of you. It will require faith, courage, and an opening of yourselves to the movements of God's Spirit in your life. Is it your desire this day to open your life to following Christ so that those who know you might see your life and know that God is at the heart of who you are and what you stand for?

Confirmands: It is. I will seek to follow God with everything that I have.

(Ralph Anderson) Confirmation is not an ending point but rather an equipping for a life-long journey with God. It is not about a “religion” practiced on Sunday, but a daily way of choosing to live that puts Jesus and God's kingdom above all other aspects of our lives. We recognize today that none of us are perfect. There will be detours along the way; moments when we make mistakes and lose our way. 5 simple things you can do

**to make the world a better place
for people with mental illnesses
and their families**

1 Be a friend

Provide companionship and compassion on the road toward recovery. Offer a ride to church or to a local support group. Listen without judgement. Pray for those you know with mental illnesses and for their family members.

2 Be an inspiration

Share your story. Has mental illness impacted you or your family in some way? Your story may empower others to seek treatment or have hope.

3 Watch your language

Pay attention to the words you use and avoid stigmatizing labels. Do not refer to people as "crazy," "psycho," "lunatic" or "mental."

4 Be a "StigmaBuster"

Challenge negative attitudes toward mental illness among your friends and acquaintances and in the media.

5 Learn the facts

Educate yourself about the various mental illnesses. Attend a lecture or class or use the Internet. Good places to start include the National Alliance on Mental Illness, www.nami.org, and the National Institute of Mental Health, www.nimh.nih.gov.



Did you know...?

Mental illnesses are medical conditions.

Research has shown that mental illness has a biological basis. Mental illnesses are brain disorders associated with changes in the brain's structure, chemistry and function, which in turn affects how a person thinks, feels and acts.

One in every four adults is affected by mental illness.

The National Institute of Mental Health reports that one in four adults in the U.S. experience some kind of mental health disorder in a given year. However, the main burden of illness is concentrated in a much smaller proportion. Approximately 1 in 17 Americans, or about 13.6 million people, live with a serious mental illness such as schizophrenia, major depression or bipolar disorder.

Stigma prevents many people from seeking treatment.

Approximately 60 percent of adults and almost one-half of youth ages 8 to 15 with a mental illness received no mental health services in the previous year. In some locations, services simply are not available or are not affordable to the people who need them. In many cases, people avoid treatment because of the fear of stigma.

Treatment works and recovery is possible.

There is no "cure" for mental illness, but with effective treatment (which may include medication, therapy, other services and support), most people experience relief from their symptoms and live productive, fulfilling lives.

Most people with mental illness are not violent.

The most common form of violence by those who have mental illness is violence against themselves. People with serious mental illnesses are far more likely to be victims of violent crime than perpetrators of it.



Last summer I traveled to South Africa with a group from our church. Our mission was primarily to assist groups working with people, mostly children, who are infected or affected by the HIV/AIDS epidemic which still seriously challenges South Africa.

I was especially amazed and moved by the work of Sparrow Ministries in Johannesburg. Sparrow was originally founded in 1991 as an AIDS hospice, but now that life-saving drugs are easily available, its programming also includes an orphanage, a preschool, after-school homework assistance, music and sports programs, a residential program for mothers with infants and children, job training, medical and home-based care, and even art and craft programs with a retail store teaching entrepreneurship.

We listened as young kids read to us. We held the hands of very ill women and men in the hospice. We listened as teen boys played music in a marimba quartet and as two teen girls read and sang original poetry and songs. We joined in football. In a few short days, these incredible people changed my life. I'll never forget them.

But Sparrow urgently needs our help right now. They receive some corporate and government funding, but depend heavily on individual contributions. I've recently reached my 75th birthday, and I hope to channel most of the celebrating into spreading the good news of Sparrow among my friends and family, and raise urgently needed funds to support their life-giving work.

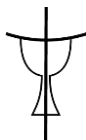
