March Advocacy Month

The Coalition launched the inaugural community schools advocacy month in March. With the support of our partners, advocates educated legislators at the local, state, and federal levels about the community schools strategy.

First Annual Coordinators Appreciation Week

Our first Coordinators Appreciation Week was a huge success with almost 1,000 tweets that reached over 700,000 unique Twitter users on why #CoordinatorsRock! Everyone from Vancouver, WA to Lincoln, NE; from Albuquerque, NM to Philadelphia, PA; and from Hartford, CT to Knoxville, TN joined the social media campaign to thank their community school coordinators.

Increased State-Level Action

Community schools continued to gain traction at the state level in 2017. 36 states included chronic absence as the new non-academic indicator in their Every Student Succeeds Act state plans, opening the door for them to consider community schools as a proven strategy to address chronic absence. Pennsylvania's ESSA state plan in particular, lifts up community schools as an effective strategy for school improvement.

In 2017 the Coalition released voluntary standards for individual community school sites and initiatives.
