

## **Tulsa Mayor's Veterans Advisory Council March 23, 2017 Meeting Minutes**

The regular Mayor's Veterans Council Meeting was held on the third Thursday at VFW Post 577 in Tulsa.

The Meeting was called to order at 2 PM by Sandy Oxford, of the Veterans Center at the Eastgate business center on 21st Street.

### **General**

15. Tulsa is only one of two USA cities who have a Medal of Honor Day. It is on April 29<sup>th</sup> with ceremonies the day before (the 28<sup>th</sup>) at the Tulsa Air and Space Museum and at Floral Haven's military area the 29<sup>th</sup>.

16. Aspen Dental will be having a vets assistance day fairly soon. I will get dates and coverage for you. I know last year, they did a Saturday Vets Day with free fillings and extractions.

17. For seniors aged 60 and older, LIFE offers free IRS certified volunteers to help for those making less than \$54,000. You must schedule a phone appointment for this free service. Call LIFE Senior Services at 918-664-9000 and ask to be connected to the Tax Assistance Appointment Reservation Line.

-An online program, MyFreeTaxes, does 100% free federal and state preparation through software powered by H & R Block. This is free if you made less than \$64,000 in 2016. Check [myfreetaxes.com](http://myfreetaxes.com).

The Medical Assistance Program (“MAP”) of the State of Oklahoma has a free Medicare program flyer showing what presentative service, how often it is allowed as well as added details such as coverage etc. For example, for cardiovascular screenings, they are allowed every 5 years if no apparent symptoms, with 100% Medicare coverage.
