FYI: Post 308 has the volunteer services of a Public Information Officer, Craig Treiber.

One of our PIO's duties is to attend the Tulsa Mayor's Monthly Veterans Advisory Council. This is a group of service agencies, small to larger entities as well as individuals who have a focus on helping area veterans and their families. At the first meeting of 2017, about ninety folks attended; representing about 45 or 50 different veteran aid organizations.

This group is under the supervision of Sandra (Sandy) Oxford, Office Manager of the Tulsa Veterans Center in the Eastgate Complex, 14002 East 21st Street, Suite 200, Tulsa, OK 74134. Phone 918-628-2760. Her e-mail is Sandra.oxford@va.gov.

-This group meets at the VFW facility, 1109 6th Street on the third Thursday of each month, with the group coming to order at 2 PM. For those interested, the VFW kitchen has a lunch available for \$6.00, starting at 1 PM.

The range of available help, aid, education, training and more is very significant to and for Tulsa area veterans and their families. However, there has not been any way to share what is available from this group's participants without each Post sending a representative to this meeting.

I have asked our Mohawk Post 308 PIO to keep attending these meetings AND to prepare a written synopsis of the main presentations which could benefit members of all the Tulsa County American Legion Posts. He will be doing this monthly so all Tulsa County Post Commanders may share this information with their membership as they may see fit.

Mr. Treiber, PIO, will prepare a draft memo for our Post 308 management review and approval. A final, informative note can then be sent by e-mail by our PIO to the various Post Commanders. In this way, valuable veteran information will get to each Post for helping the members of that post.

New Mayor GT Bynum had his Deputy Chief of Staff, Amy Brown, attend our meeting to learn and hear how the Mayor can help area veterans and their families.

A January 13, 2017 VA memo has described the diseases fostered by the contaminated water in, at and under Camp Lejeune from August 1, 1953 to December 31, 1987.

A Nobesity Revolution 2 K walk will kick off at the VFW on 6th Street with registration starting at 8 AM with the actual walk at 10 AM. An "After" Party will be from 11 AM to 1 PM.

There will be a Veterans Employment Group job fair January 25th at Eastgate Workforce Center, 14002 E. 21st Street, Suite 1030. This will be from 9 to 11 AM.

The Cherokee Nation has a National Grant to help displaced vets with new training as well as some funding during the training periods and help finding new work at the end of the training. In addition to the vet getting fully paid, no charge training, an employer hiring the individual can get up to 75% wage refunds for up to 6 months.

Sandy reviewed the VA Form for Vets to claim for travel reimbursement F10-3542, and Form 10325, to state your advance medical disclosure permissions through TRIWEST et al. A form was discussed where a vet can pre-state his/her wishes for end of life issues such as burial in a VA National Cemetery etc. Get VA Form # 40-10007

At the February 22, 2017 Meeting, Sandy sadly reported we have lost a 44 year old lady vet and a 25 year old male marine recently. Suicide among female veterans returning to civilian life but not having any ties or involvement with support personnel and/or services is in excess of 95%. This is just plain shocking.
